
FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE

We thought Edith used her kindness value by helping both sides from the war


This poorly soldier needs a bandage!





COMPARING OUR THREE NURSES





Not all of the nurses got an award

Florence Nightingale is remembered for changing the way hospitals were run.


Mary Seacole wanted to join the nurses treating the soldiers injured in the Crimean War but the British Government refused because of the colour of her skin.
