I can draw what the Trinity means to me.

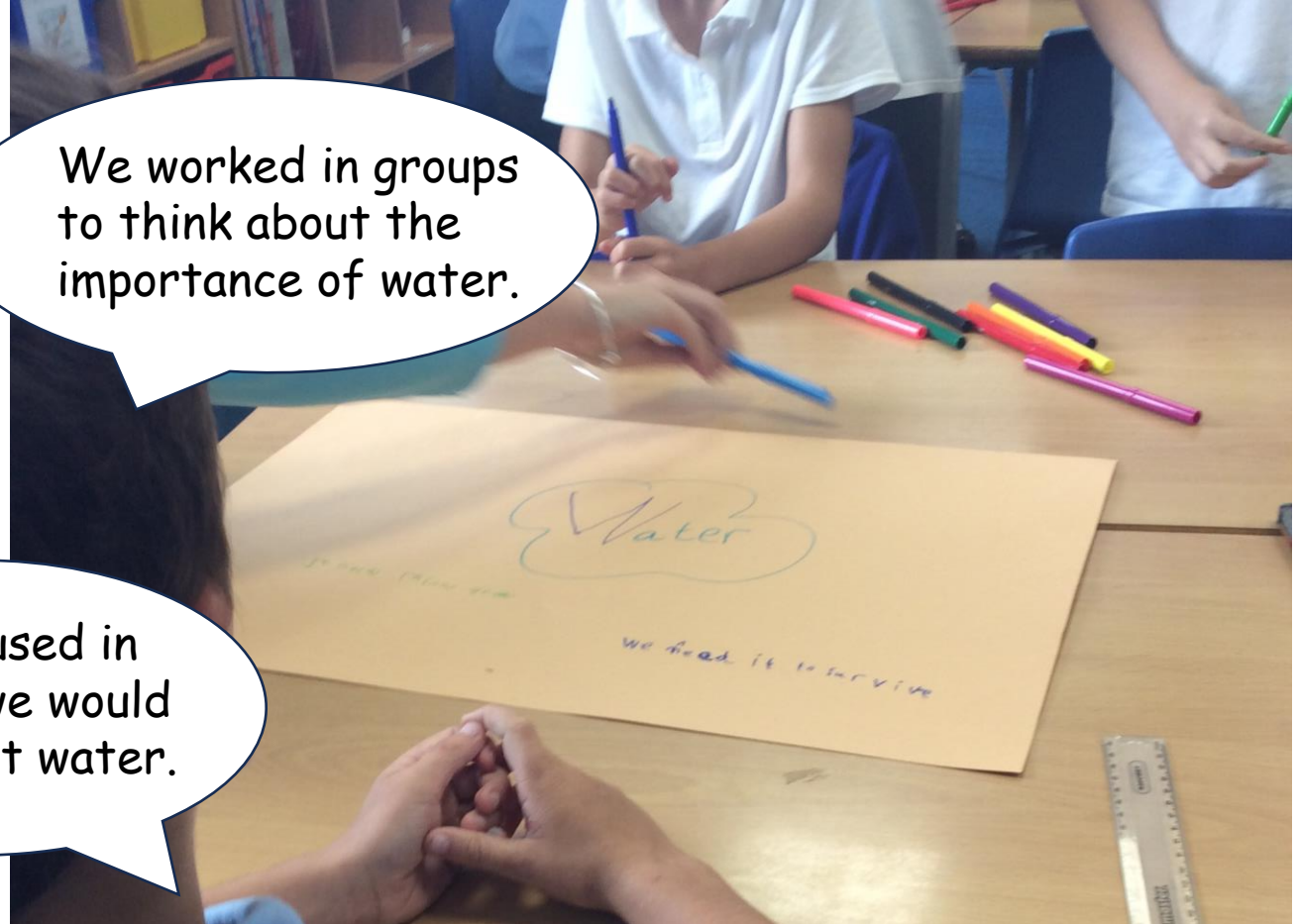
We thought about the importance of water and why it is important to Christians.



We worked in groups to think about the importance of water.



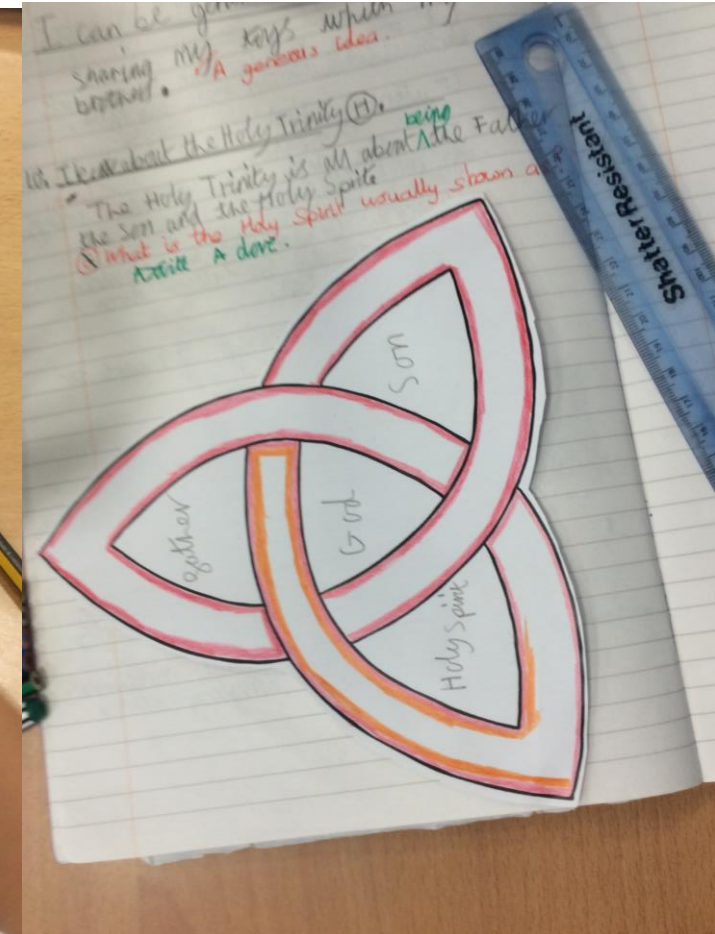
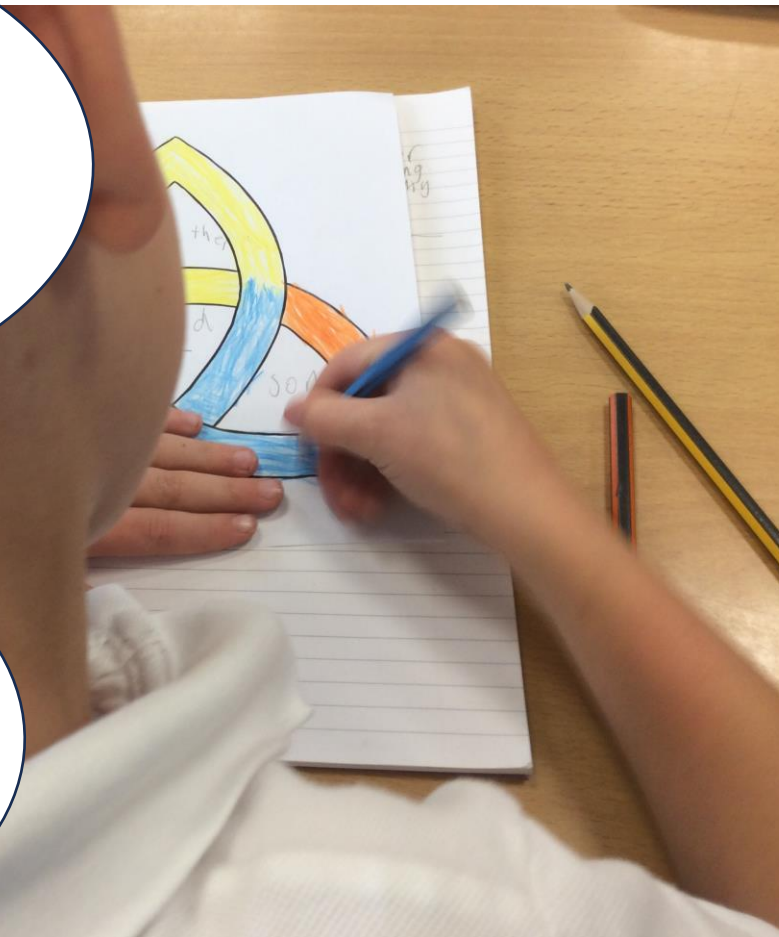
Water is used in baptism, we would die without water.

Verrocchio and Leonardo

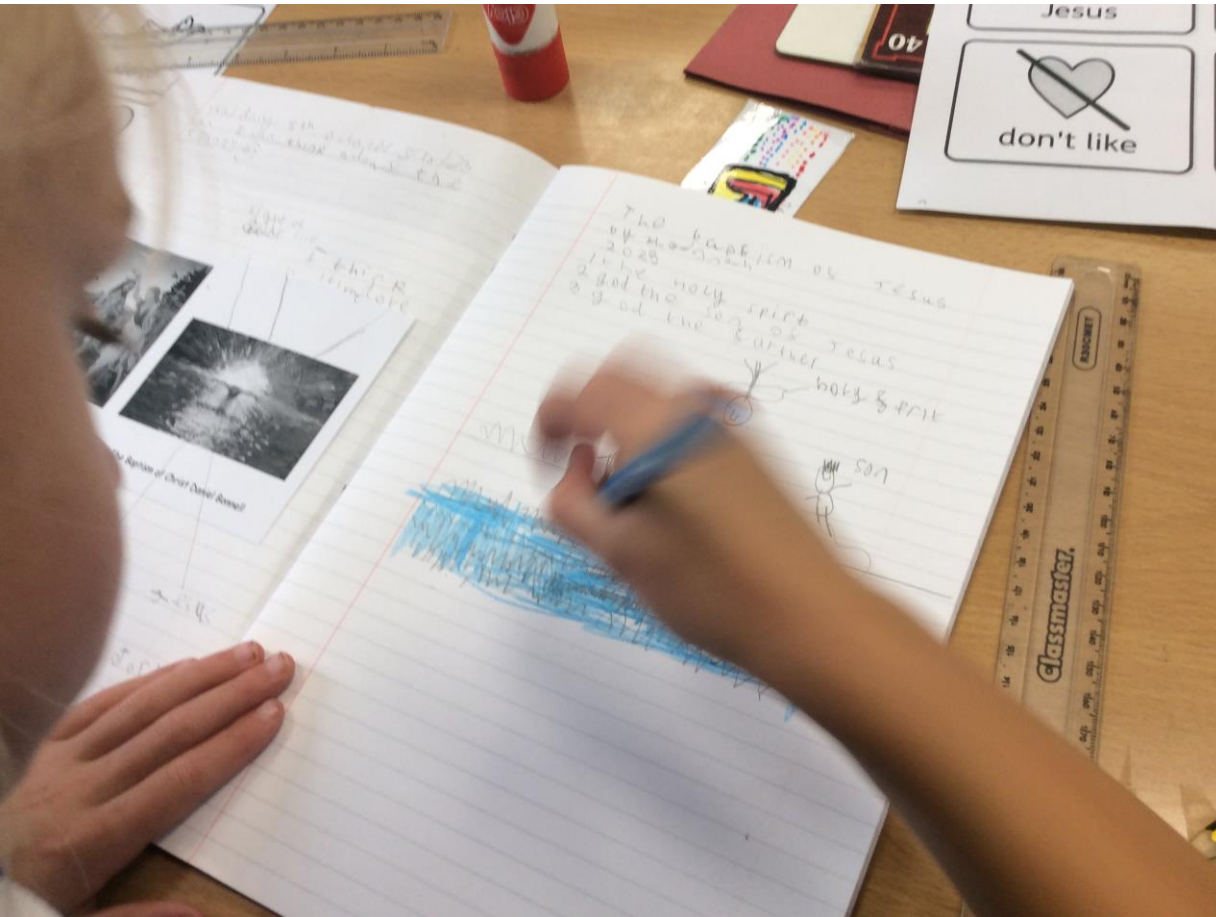
We looked at pictures of the baptism of Jesus. One picture had Jesus, John the Baptist and the Holy Spirit as a dove and Gods hands at the top.



The Baptism of Christ Daniel Bonnell


The other picture had Jesus being baptised in the River Jordan with a light behind him.

We created our own picture of the baptism of Jesus to show the three parts of the Trinity.




I showed the Holy Spirit as a dove and God in the sky.

We watched videos about baptism, one an adult and one a child. We wrote down our thoughts.

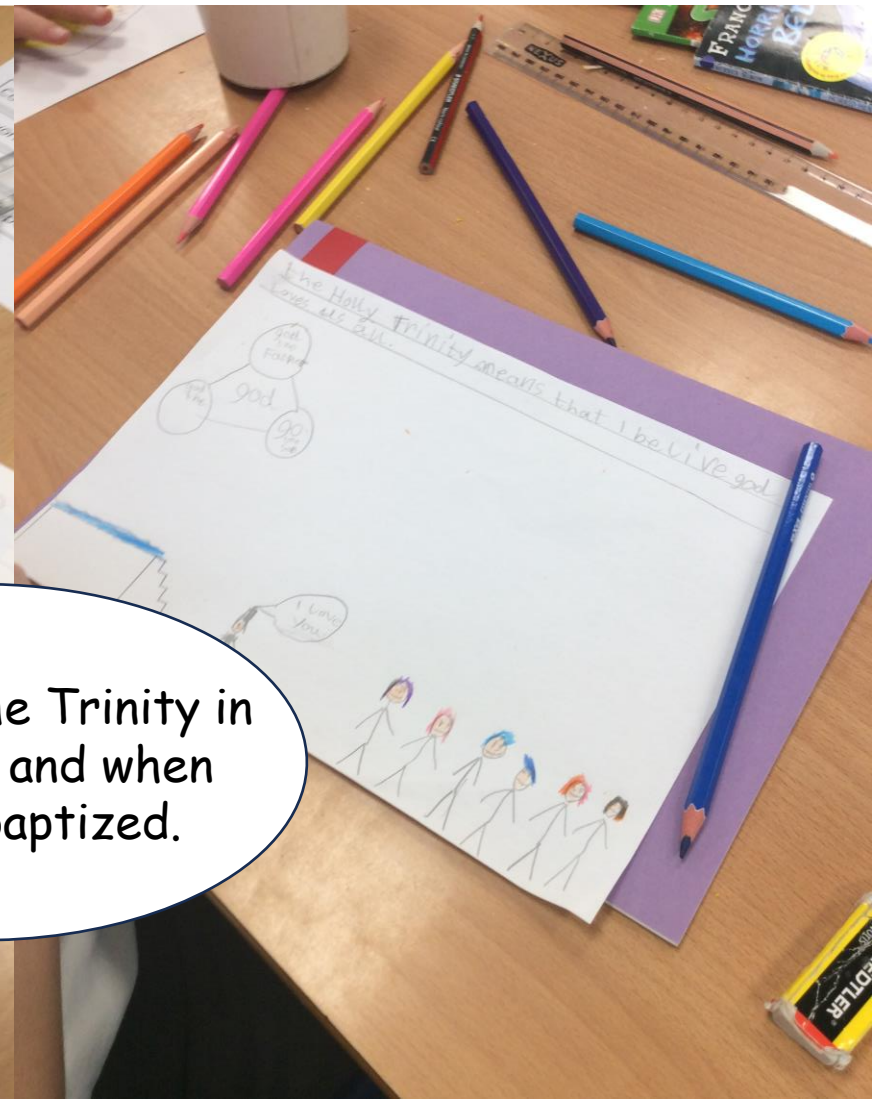

We created our own picture showing what the Trinity means to us.

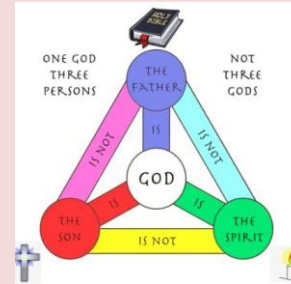


I showed the Trinity in three parts and when Jesus was baptized.

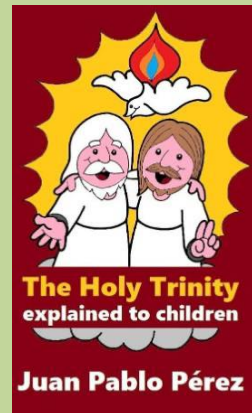

Baptism	the Christian ceremony of sprinkling holy water on the head and welcoming the person into the church.
Holy Spirit	the third person in the Trinity often shown as a dove.
