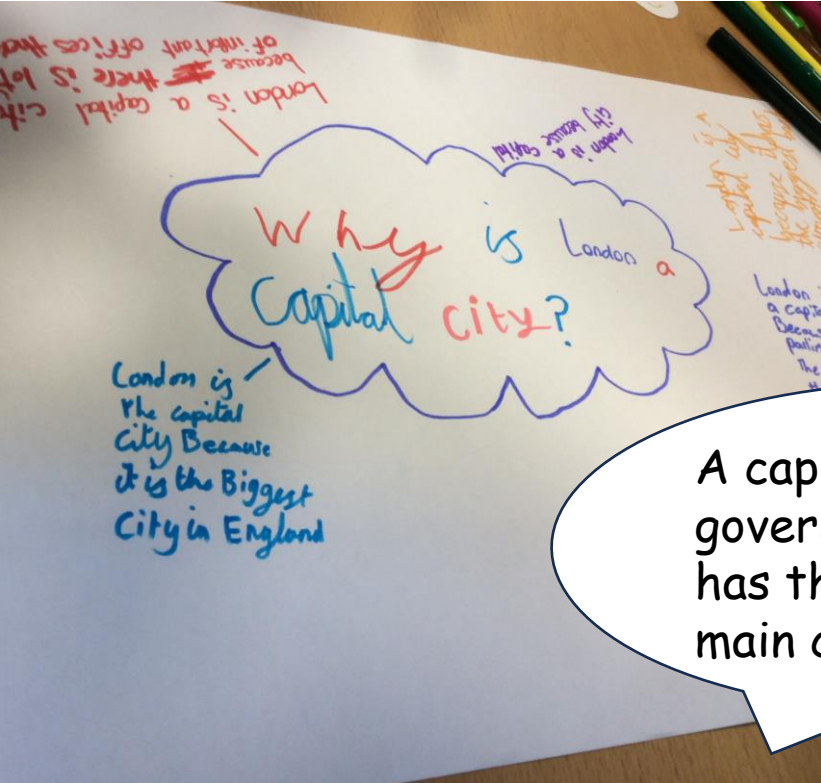


We first thought about what we already knew about London.

A capital city has the government there. It has the biggest and main court.

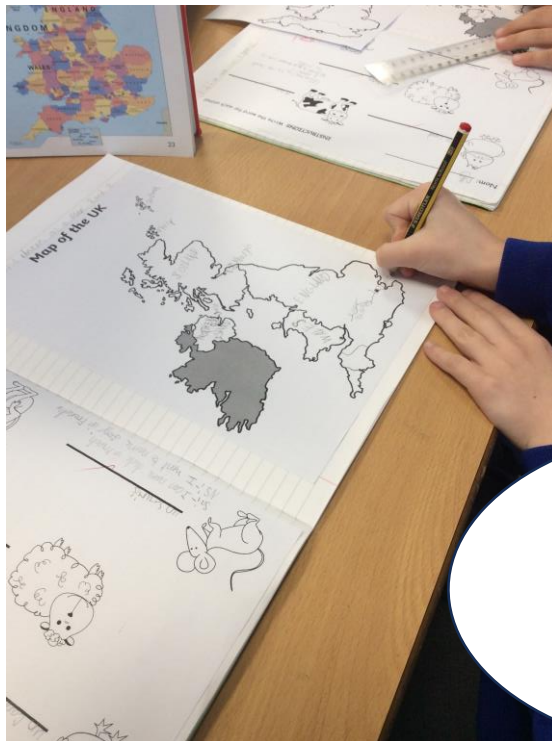




Malta's capital city is Valetta and Norway's capital is Oslo.

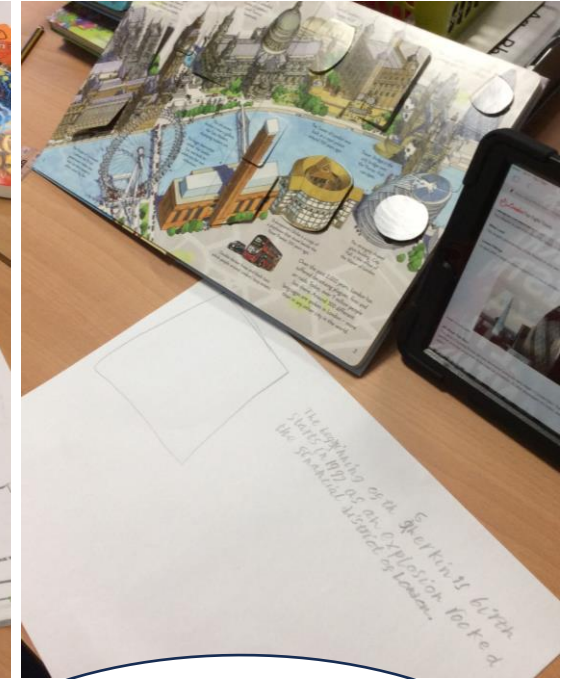
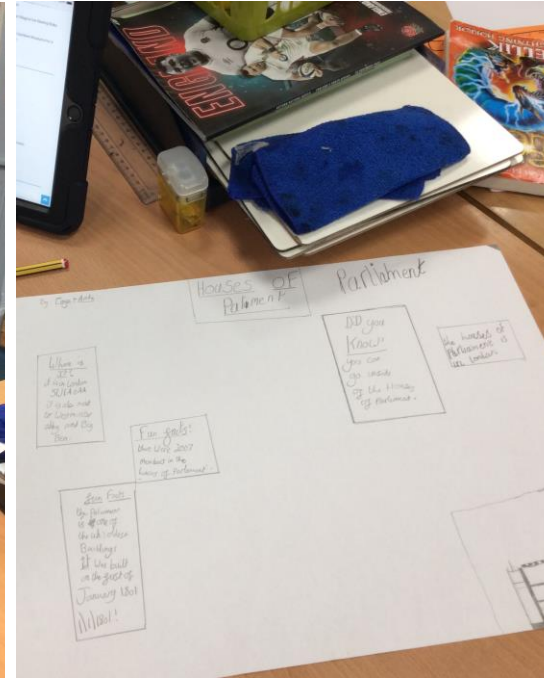
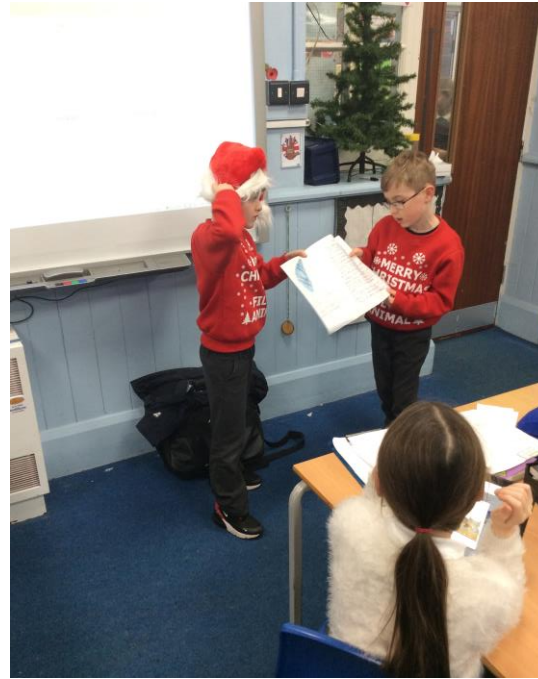
We used atlases to find different capital cities in Europe. The capital cities in the atlases were shown with a red star.
