




# Being SMART online.

We must never:

**Safe** – Keep out information such as name and age and location private.

**Meet**– never meet people we don't know or have only spoken to online.

**Accept** –Never accept or click on any links, always have a grown-up with you to say if it's okay or not.

**Reliable** – Not every thing you read on the internet is reliable or true.

**Tell** – If anything bother's you online, tell a grown-up or trusted person.

## SMART Zoo


Welcome to SMART Zoo. This zoo is very special because all the animals love to go online and use the Internet!

# What personal information is safe to share with strangers or people that we don't know very well?




I would never tell anyone what school I go to or they might try to pick me up at the end of the day!


We shouldn't tell people what our favourite toy is because they could buy the toy and try to get you to speak to them or meet them with the toy you like.

Don't tell people where you live or they might come to your house




We Emailed Mrs Blackler in the office to see how quickly she would reply.



I'm doing an email to the bear to see if he liked the crumble.








# Information for alien Zibb on how to stay safe online






What we already know: Not to talk to strangers. Put your name on your work. Don't go online without an adult. Check with an adult if you're not sure.

**Knowledge**

- Anything that you create is yours and belongs to you.
- Some search engines have filters that make them safer for you to use.
- You should speak to a trusted adult if you see, hear or read anything online that upsets you.
- You shouldn't go on things online that are not suitable for your age.
- If you don't save your work, you will lose it.
- Always remember to put your name and date on your work so that everyone knows that it is yours and cannot copy it.
- Never click on links without an adult saying that it is okay to do so.
- You shouldn't ever talk to people on the internet without an adult being with you.
- You shouldn't ever share personal information with strangers on the internet.
