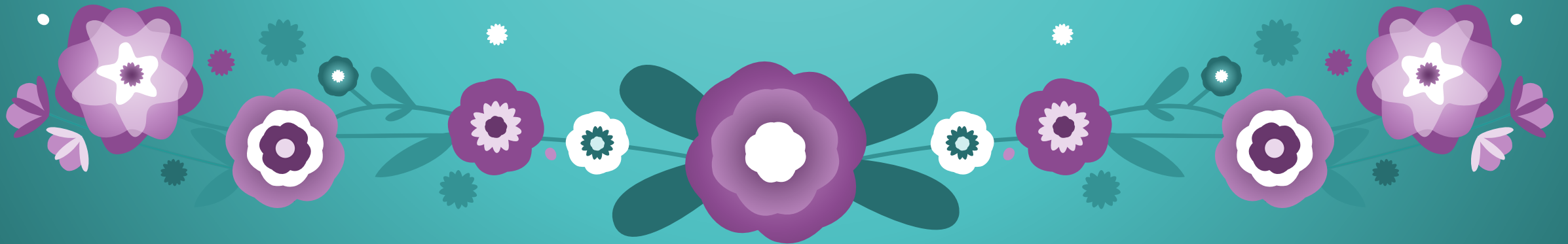


# How can fabric be used to create an Easter decoration?

# What do I know about fabrics and materials?

We spotted familiar fabrics and named them. We explored the different fabrics and described how they felt.



We made links to our RE by looking at Easter Eggs and how they are a sign of new life.

# How do I design my Easter decoration using fabrics?

## Agreed Design Criteria

- Use a template to make the egg shape
- Make your design colourful and eye catching using different patterns.
- Label your design
- Think about the fabrics/materials you are using. Are you going to sew them on or stitch them on or both?

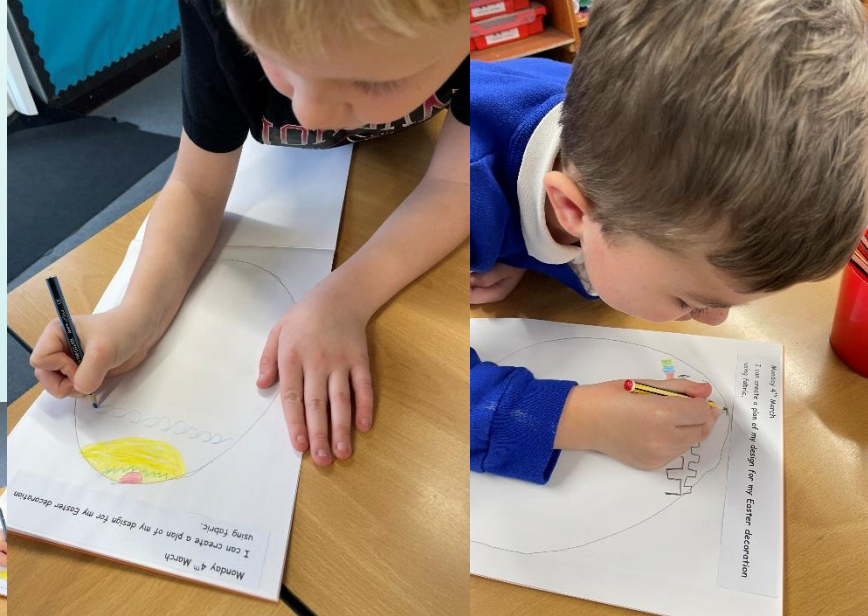
We discussed how the fabric was attached and how stitches were used in the different decorations around school.



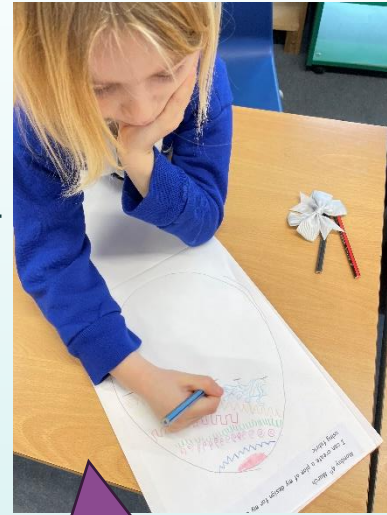


Using a template was a challenge as we had to keep it still to draw around.

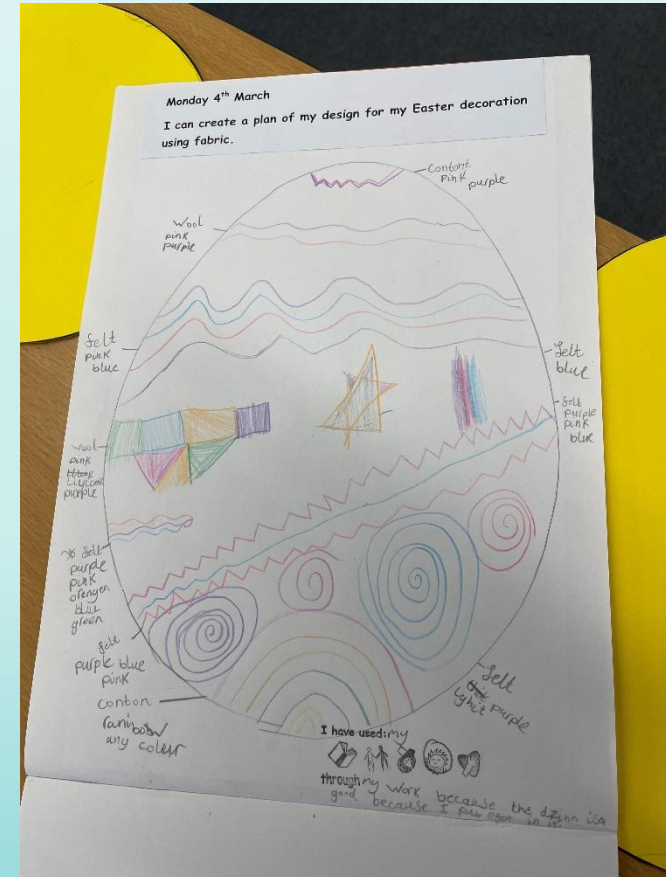
# How do I create a plan for my design for an Easter decoration using fabric?



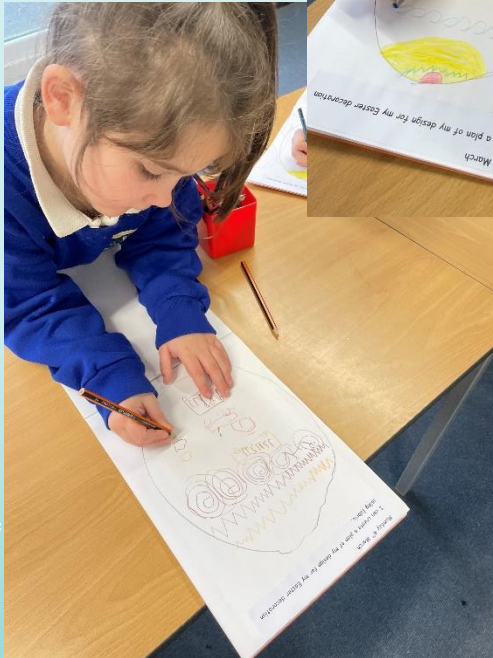
I made sure I labelled so my plan is easy to follow.

We remembered the Easter eggs we had looked at and thought about the designs we had seen.





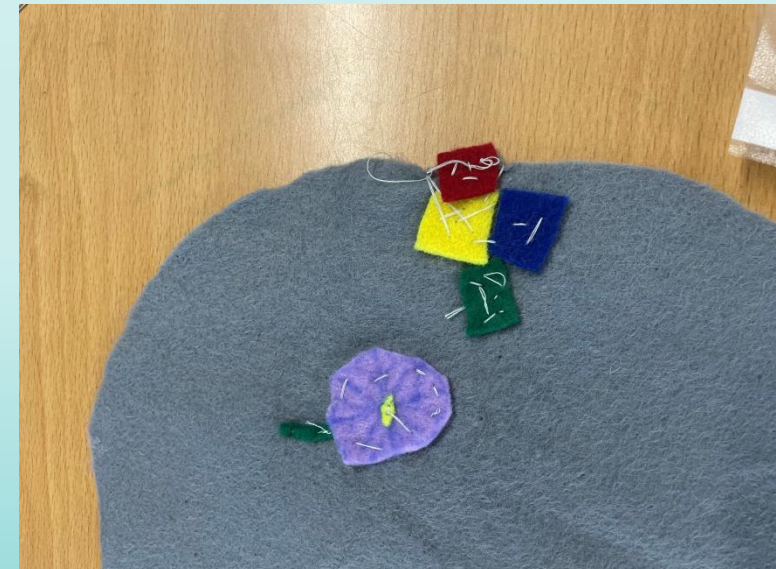
# How do I follow my design plan?

Buttons needed sewing on. It wasn't easy. I had to use a needle and thread.





# My Easter decoration and evaluation

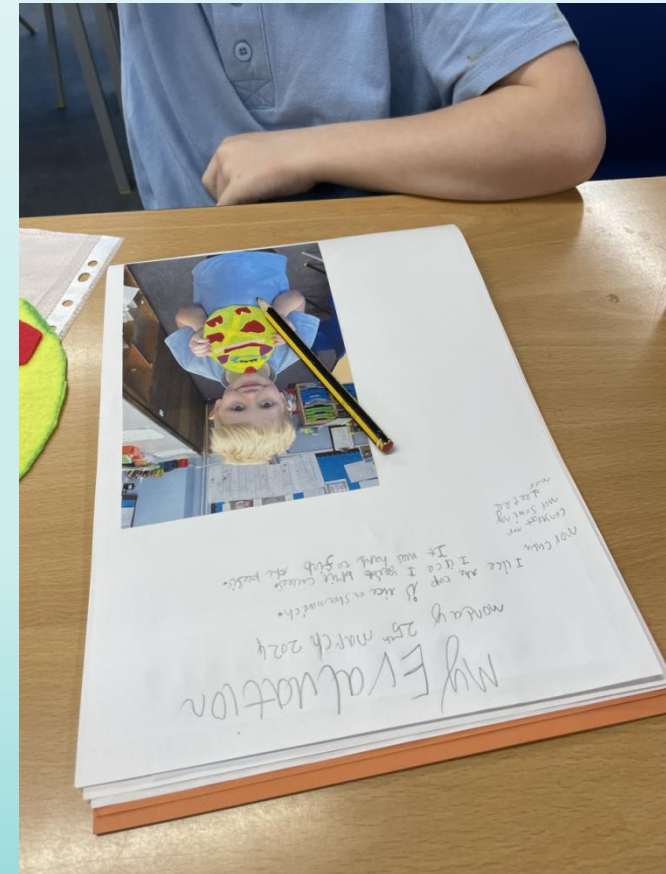
We were proud of our finished decorations and took pictures of them to go into our DT books so we could evaluate them.

## Forever Facts:

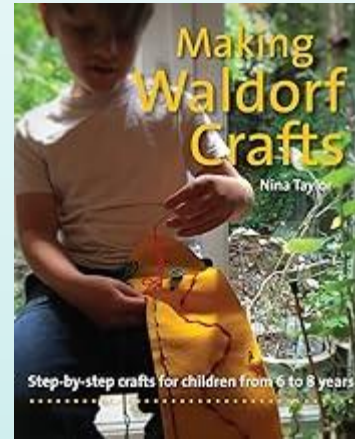
I know that fabric can be joined using stitches and PVA glue.

## Subject Specific Vocabulary

Joining and attaching	To fasten/connect one thing to another.
Fabric	Cloth or material created by knitting or weaving fibres together.
Sewing/stitches	Attaching to fabrics using a needle and thread to make stitches – we call this sewing.
Thread	Fine thin strand, often described as cotton and wrapped round a reel.
Cutting	Scissors are used for cutting. Once a cut is made it cannot be undone.
Evaluate	Thinking carefully about what worked well and what can be improved.
Design	a plan or drawing produced to show how the product will look.
