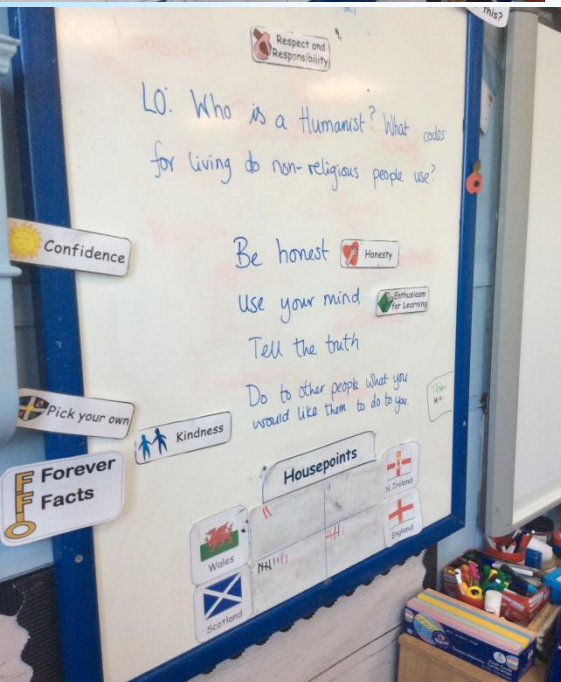
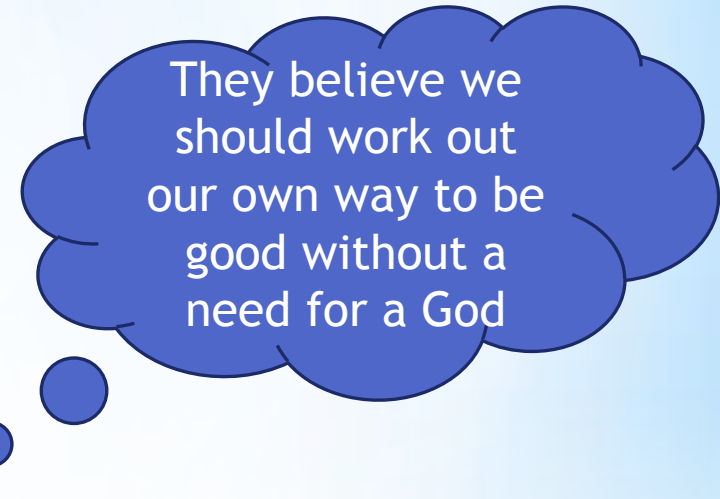
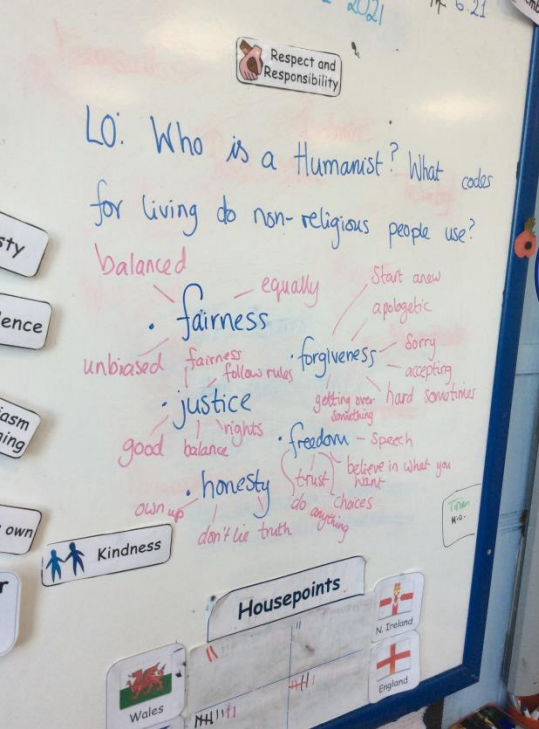


Rules link to values and we use our school values as guidance for the way we behave



I think we need rules so that everyone behaves as they should

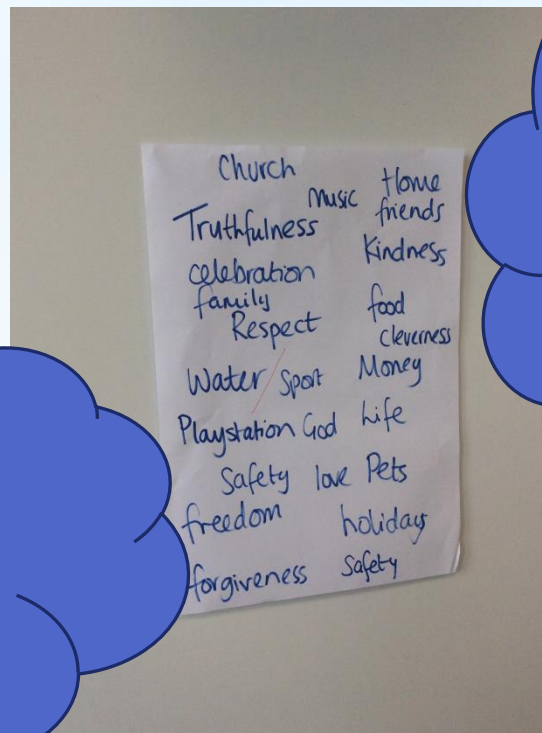
Rules - do we need them?



What is a Humanist?

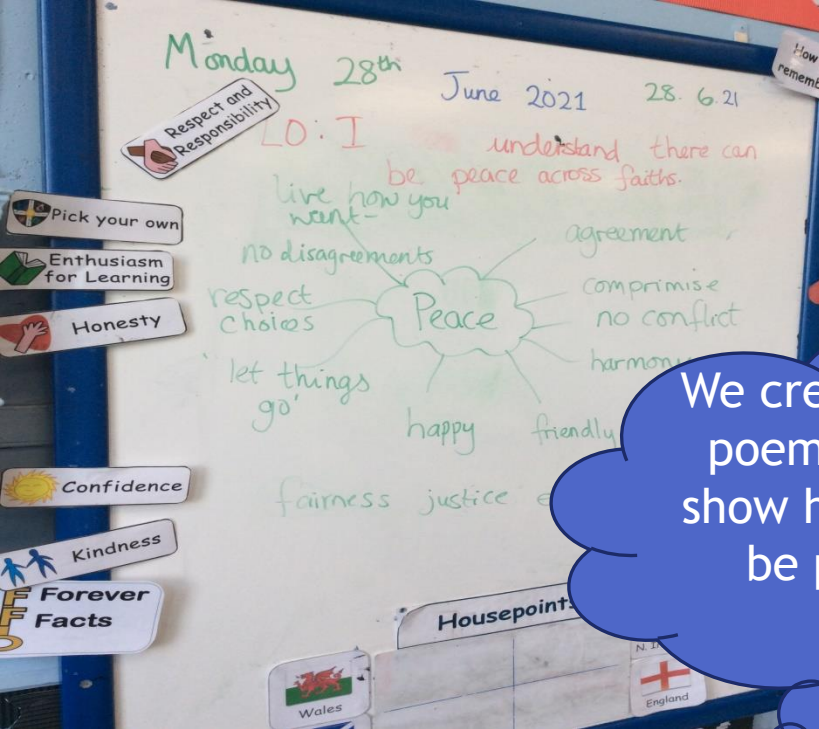


It surprised me that some values I thought were important, were also important to Christians' such as forgiveness.

What values matter the most to Christians?

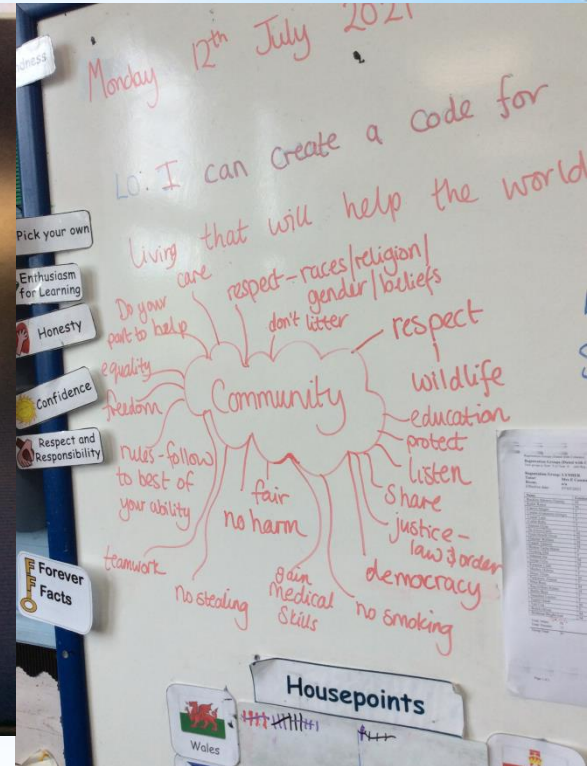
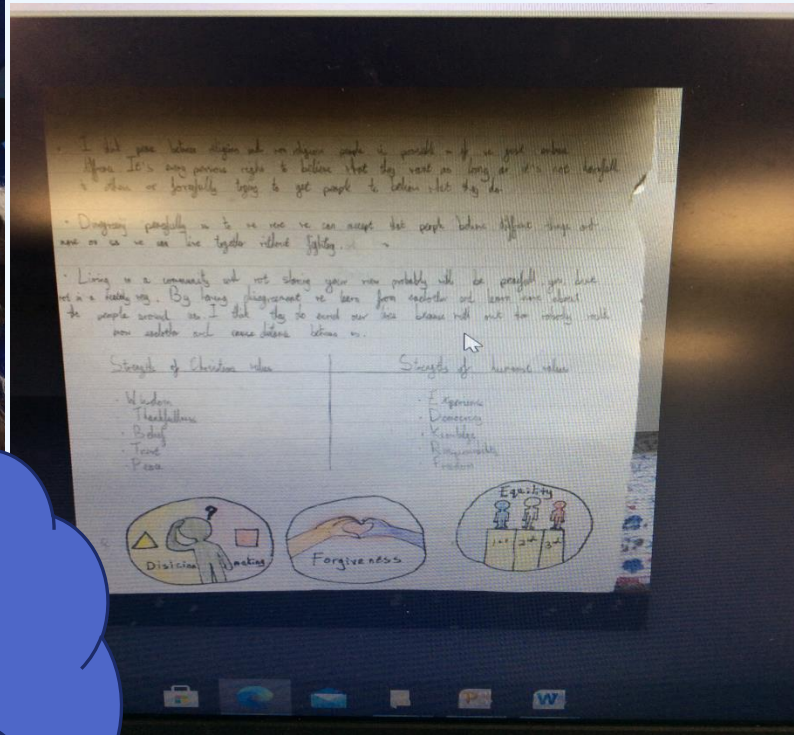
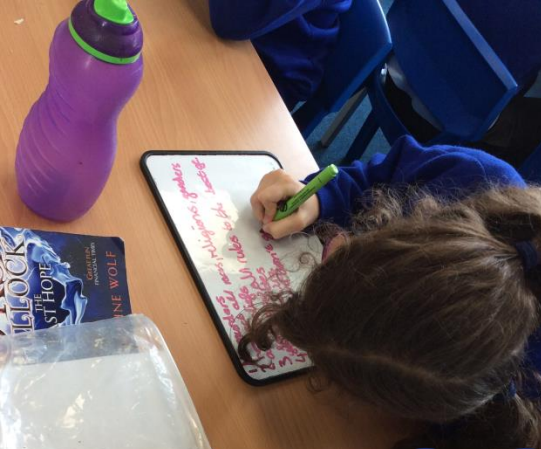


We created our peace poems and songs to show how there could be peace across faiths

Knowledge within Humanism

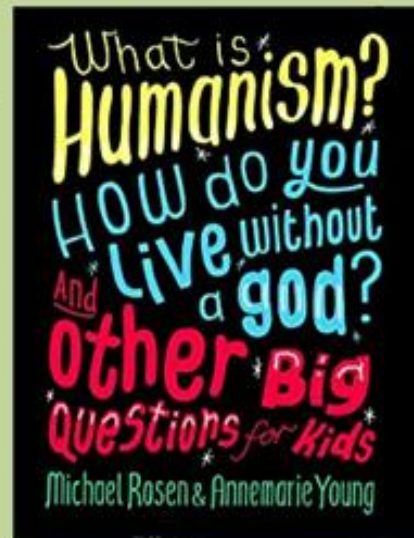

Subject Specific Vocabulary

Conscience

A person's moral sense of right and wrong, viewed as acting as a guide to one's behaviour.

Morals

Standards of behaviour; principles of right and wrong.

Values

One's judgement of what is important in life.

Virtues

A quality considered morally good or desirable in a person

SMSC: Spiritual – self awareness and reflection on own views.

Curiosity through questioning. Moral – valuing others, establishing appropriate moral codes. Social – opportunities to consider values which are or should be part of society. Cultural – making sense of the world around them.
