"Do for others what you want them to do for you: this is the meaning of the whole Law." When looking at quotes from Jesus we thought about what he meant, what would be the challenge and what difference it would make if everyone followed the teachings.

In the parable of the Two Debtors Jesus teaches people to forgive.

The soldiers were only obeying orders when they took the young man and killed him by crucifixion. The crowd gasped as the nails were hammered into his wrists. Then the cross was lifted up, and dropped into a hole in the ground. Jesus had always preached that people should be forgiving,

no matter what. As he hung there, the crowd waited to see if he would curse the soldiers, as


most victims of crucifixion did...

We looked at dilemmas and using our honesty value, we stated what we would do and what Jesus would do.




What have we learned about living by the values of Jesus in the modern world?


