I can use a map and a globe.

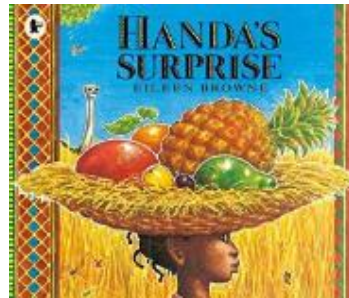
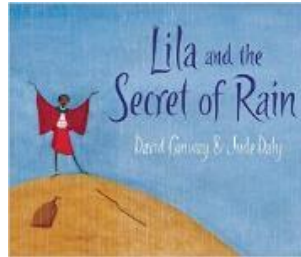
