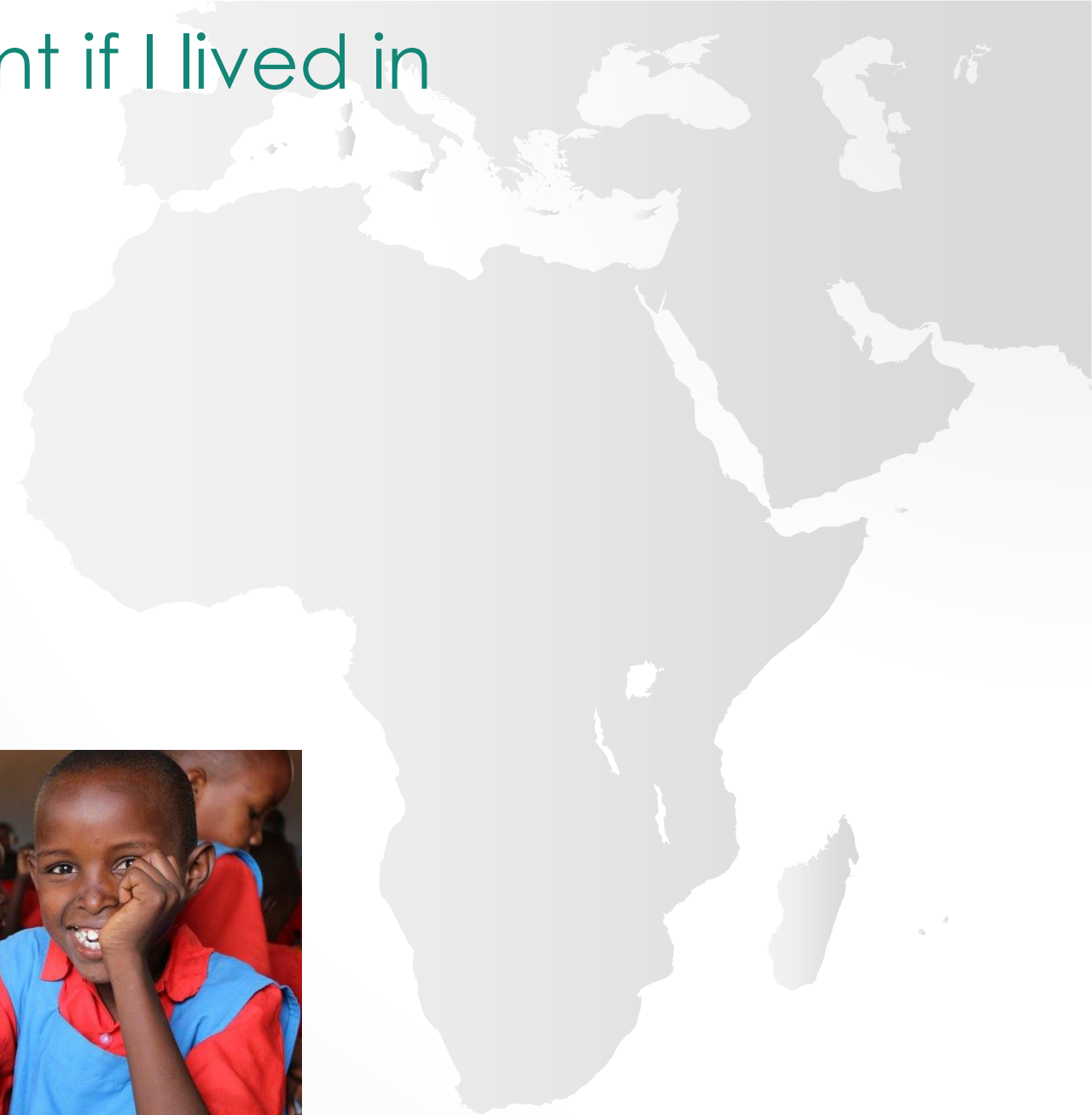

How many houses and people are there? Do things grow in Kenya? Are there wheat fields? How large is the land – how many metres? What are the schools like? What is the climate like?</p>	<p>I now know there are cities and Nairobi is the capital city. They use ferries and buses as transport. In Kenya they have rain seasons, and some places are very green. They have rain forests. They have wild animals that you can see in parks on safaris. The big 5 are: Lions, Leopards, elephants, buffalo and rhinos. There are over 60 languages spoken in Kenya. Most people speak Swahili. Jambo means 'hello'. Kenya is a great place to go on holiday and has some of the best beaches in the world. Tourists take camel rides on the beach. They eat different food to us. The flag is green red and black with a shield and spear on it.</p>

It looks dry and yellow and looks like hay. In England it is green because of all the rain.

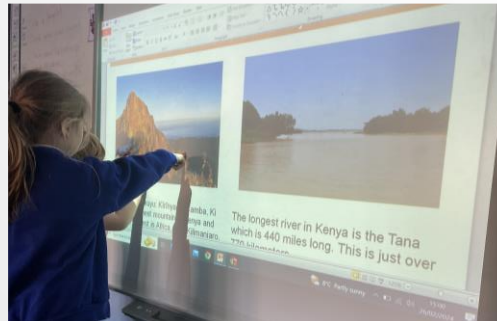
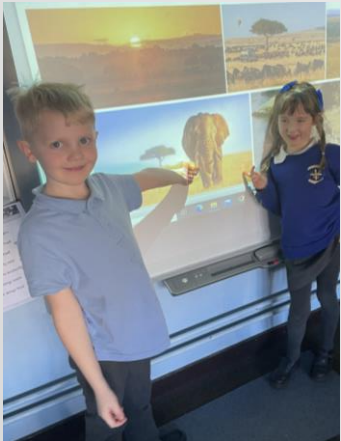
There are not many trees, and you can see at long way.

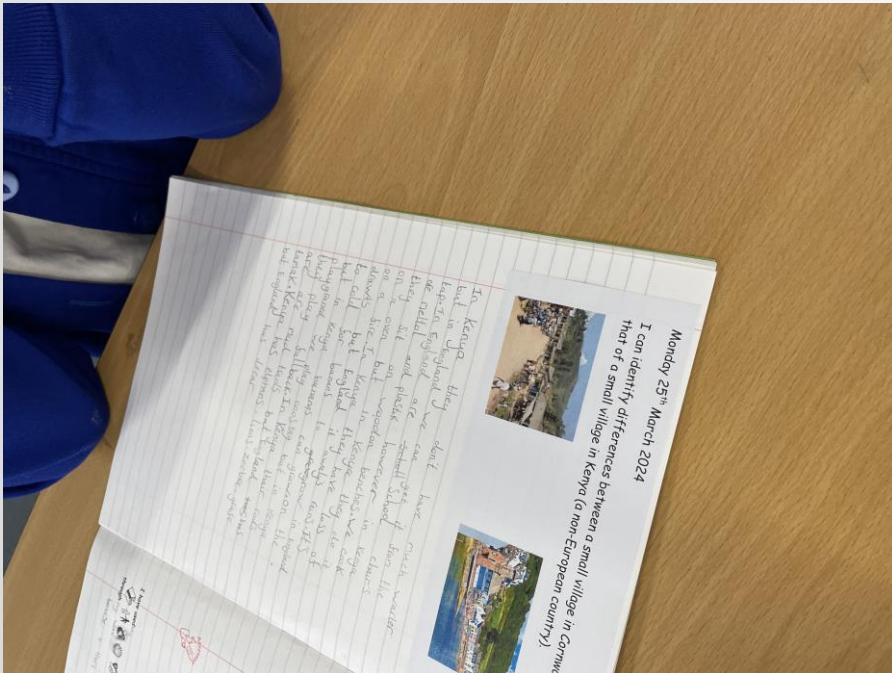
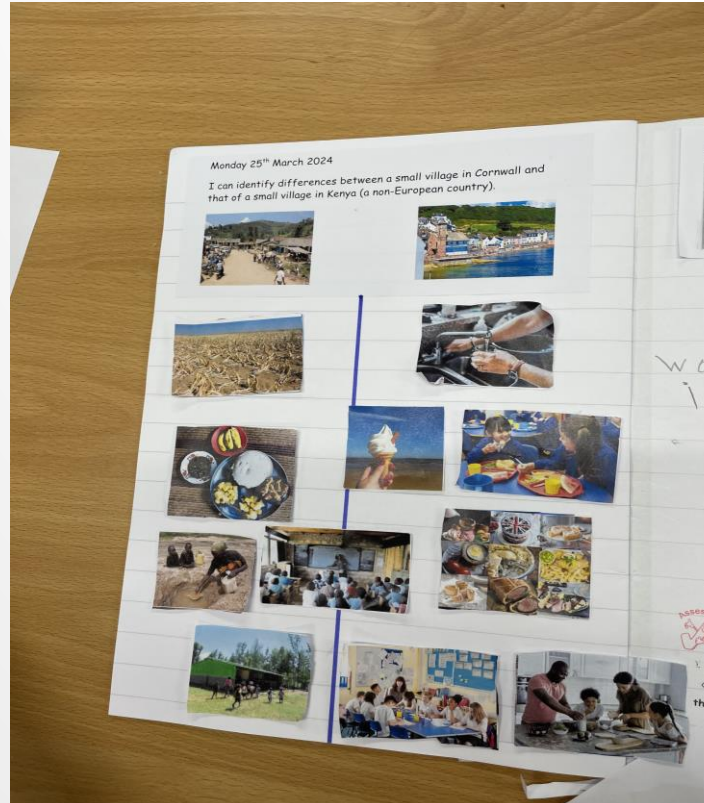

I can use a map and a globe.

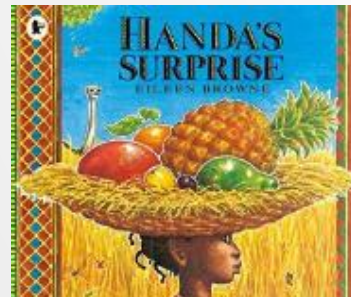
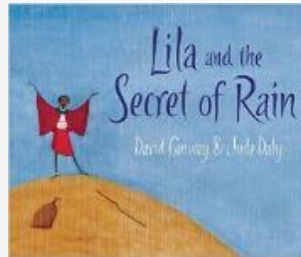
I can use photographs to consider contrasting areas.

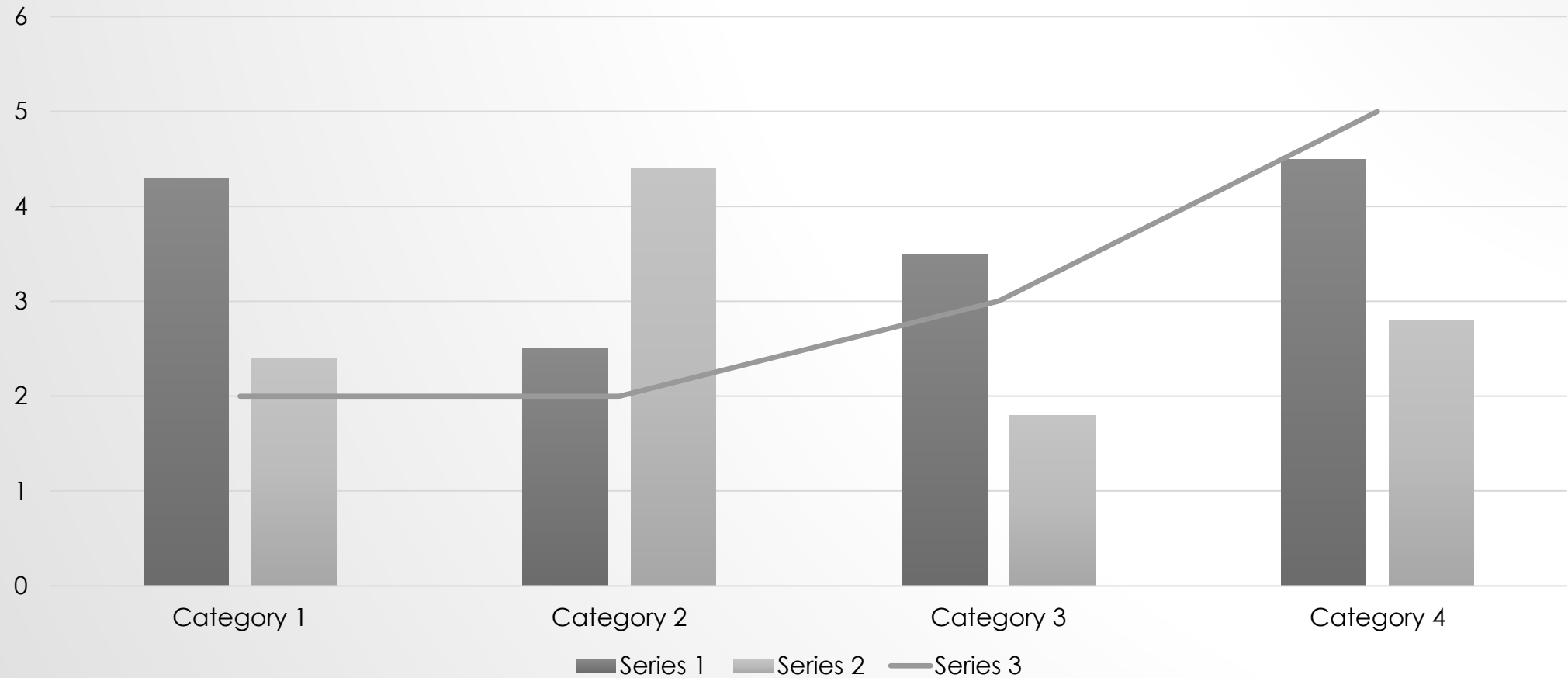

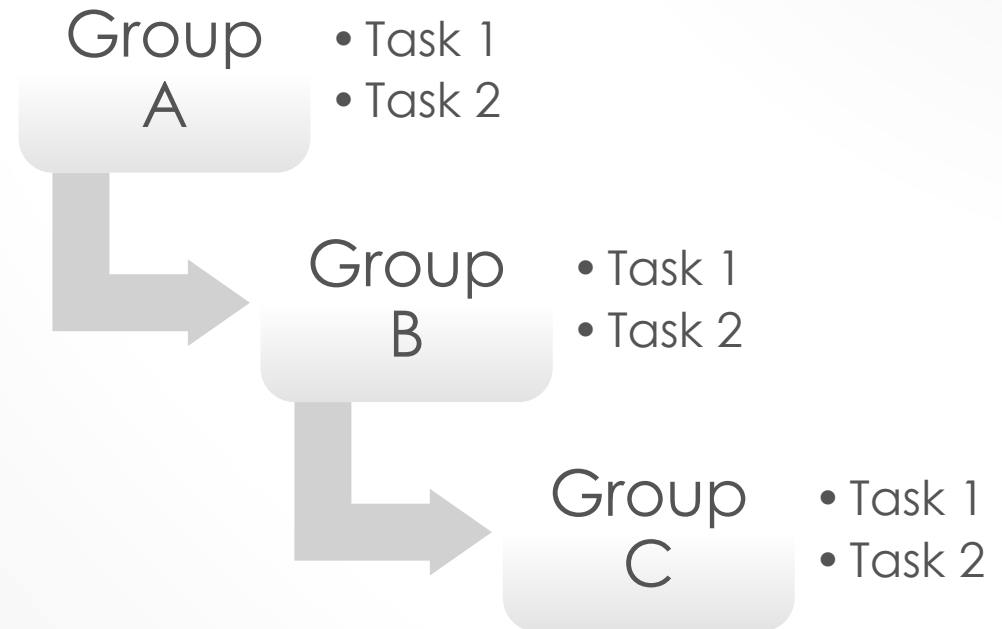
