Guy Fawkes was also known as Guido.


It's hard to believe people were hurt or imprisoned because of their faith.

I know how Henry VIII change the way we worship.




We went back further in time to see how the religious faith changed in Britain. We looked at how Henry VIII changed the country from a Catholic state to the Church of England.

Henry wanted a son so he would succeed him on the throne.


He kept marrying different woman until he got what he wanted.

Elizabeth I's reign had positive and negative aspects on England. We investigated these and the issues she faced during her reign.




During her reign England discovered the world, she created a great naval power.

Although she did make England strong and stable.


I didn't realise how many people she executed because they were Catholic!

I know why we had a civil war and who the roundheads and cavaliers were.



He was the first king to be executed!



We looked at the facts around the Great Fire of London and compared them to England today. We discussed how the shape of London changed and buildings were improved, and a fire service established.




I don't believe just 6 people died, these are just the ones they found!
