



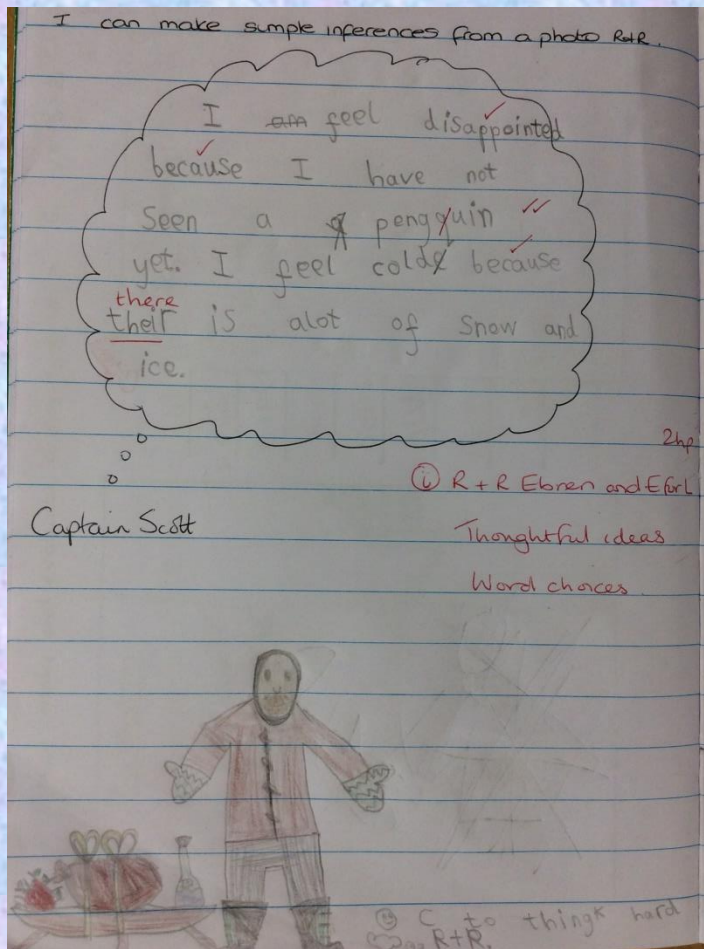

Polar Explorers

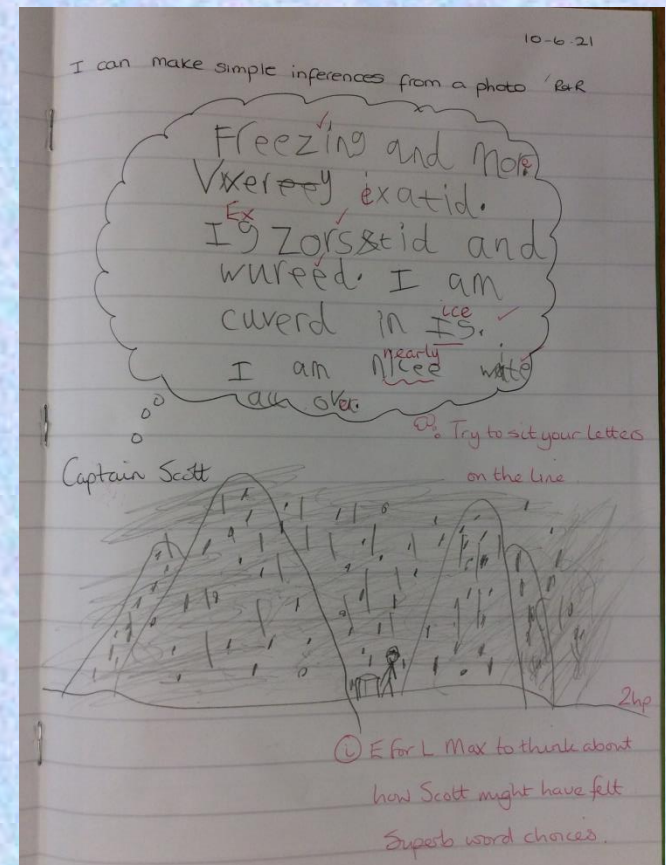

- * both kept diaries

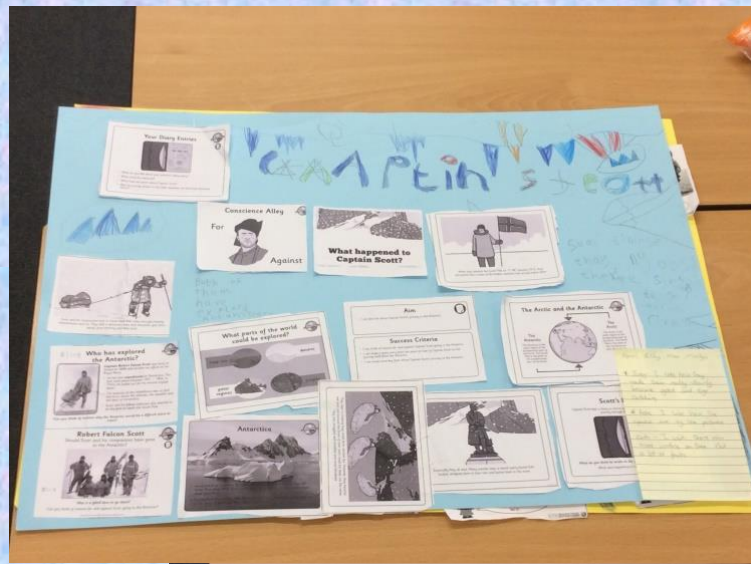
differences

- * their photos are different because Scott's photos were in black and white

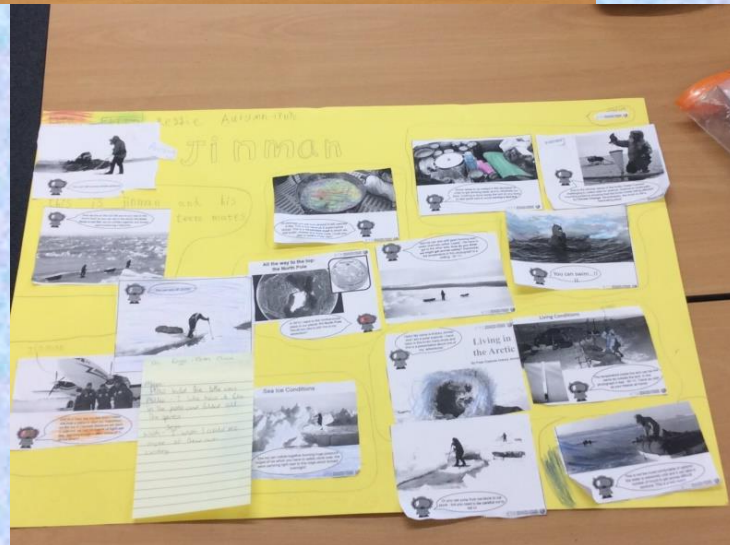
"Jinman's jacket might be warmer because it is made from new fabric and Scott's will be old fabric."

We used photos to help us compare Captain Scott's and Jinman's expeditions.

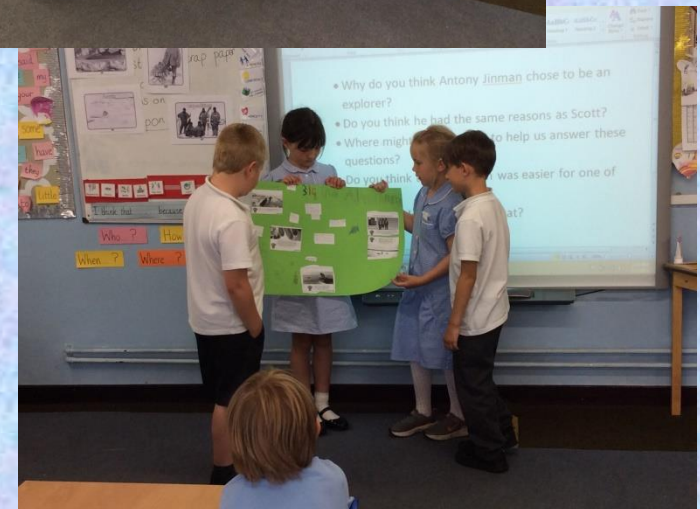


Finally, we pulled together all of the things we had learnt about the polar explorers and created fact-files. Then we presented them to our class.



"I think Antony Jinman had it easier because he had a bigger tent, warmer clothes and more food."

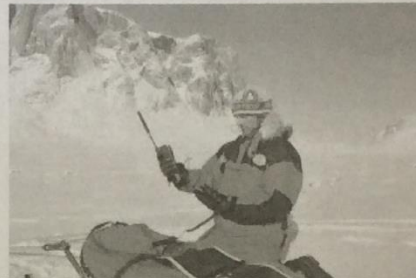
