Covid

Covid has not gone away and we are continuing high levels of vigilance in school. Our Co2 monitors have arrived and these are supporting us in ensuring adequate ventilation in classrooms. We have felt supported by the way you have all communicated with us about Covid, letting us know when there are outbreaks in households etc and this has helped us put in adequate measures at school. Please continue to do this and to use lateral flow tests. If your child is unwell and shows any Covid symptoms please ensure your child has a PCR test as soon as you can - NOT a lateral flow. You need to book these online. The quickest we have found is to book the walk in at Liskeard and the results at the moment are within 24 hours.

Perceived bullying

In fact it is very clear from talking to the children that the term is being misused by parents and carers. Actual 'bullying' at Foulanesend is rare and is dealt with swiftly. All parents and children are involved in the process and follow up checks are made.

The definition of bullying is 'The repetitive intention hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face to face or online.' - Anti-Bullying Alliance

Naturally, as in all schools we have cases of children being unkind and this is dealt with. We are very that some parents are calling other children bullies, this is very unkind and unfair. If you have a concern about an issue please speak to us.
