Landrake Inter School Cross-Country Run - Friday 10th March

The annual cross-country run for **KS2** children takes place at Sir Robert Geffery's School, Landrake. Between five and six hundred children from about thirty schools usually take part.

The course, some three 'Cornish' miles, is billed as the hardest, dirtiest, wettest but the most interesting in Cornwall. It starts and finishes at the School and takes in lanes, fields, woods, hills and a salt marsh. If you complete the course and are still dry, you've gone the wrong way!
