Subject Specific Vocabulary

Parable	a simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson, as told by Jesus in the Gospels
Peace	freedom from war and violence, especially when people live and work together happily without disagreements
Generosity	the quality of being kind and generous
Gospel	Good news - a section of the Bible
Healing	the process of making or becoming sound or healthy again.
