
“Jewish people and Christians believe in a God and that he created the world but they have different ways of saying it.”

First, we thought about the fact that Christians believe that each person is valuable and unique. We designed slogans to remind us of these beliefs.




“I think that we should all think that everyone is valuable and that we should care for them.”

What makes people valuable?




We thought about what makes people valuable – there are so many different ways!

"You could play with your friend and tell them they are your best friend forever."



"You could make them a card."
