It was interesting as they had feminine and masculine instead of just one word for my.

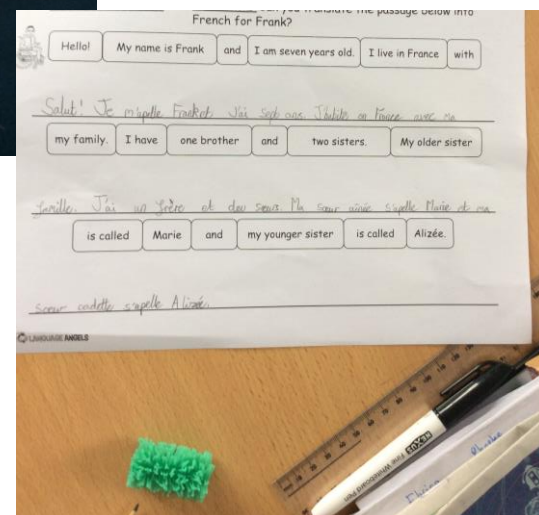
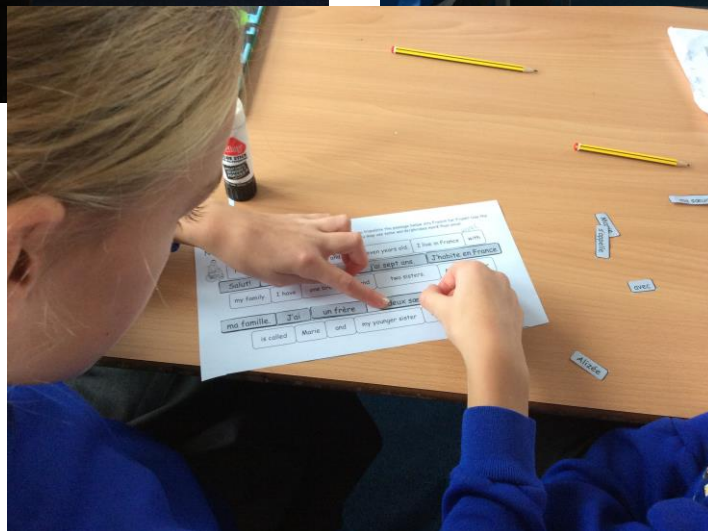
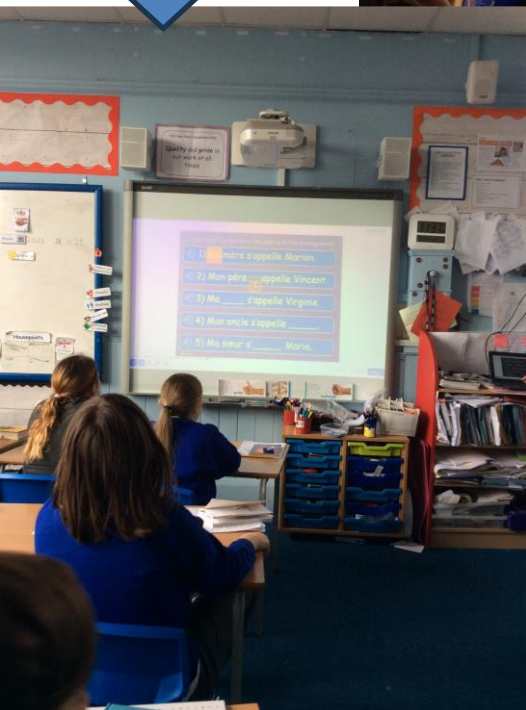
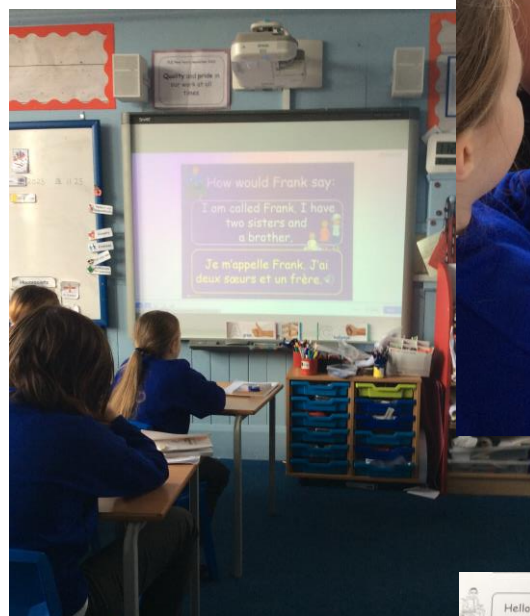
We learnt to answer the question 'As-tu des frères et soeurs?'
