We practised turning a conflict into a learning moment via scenarios.

My culture is my own, it is influenced by family and where they come from.



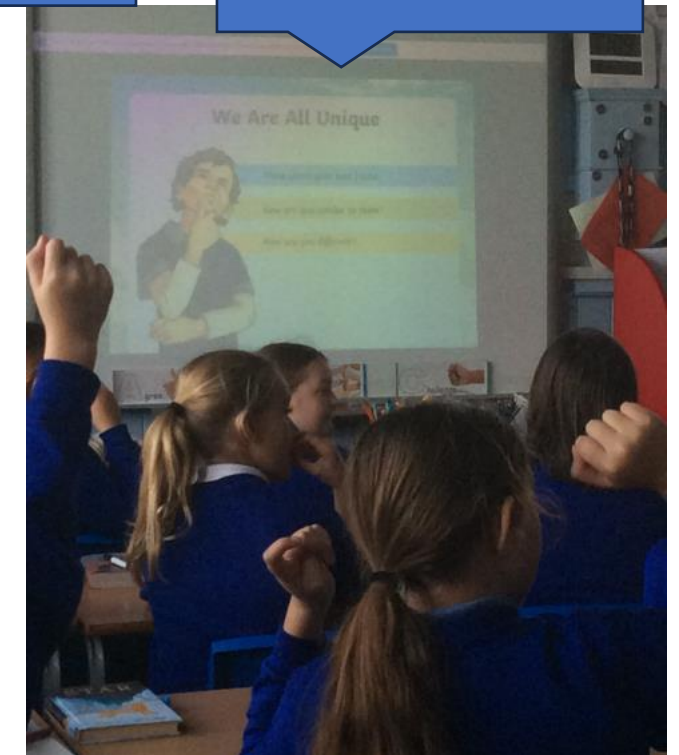
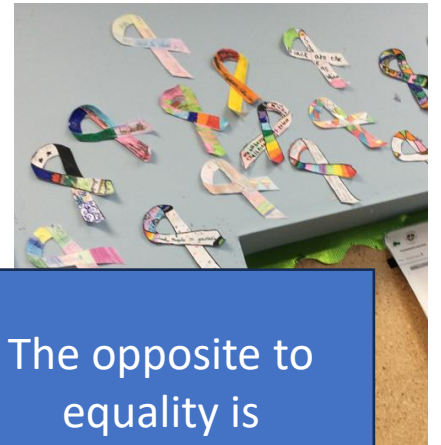
I know what racism is and strategies to prevent it.

The opposite to equality is discrimination.



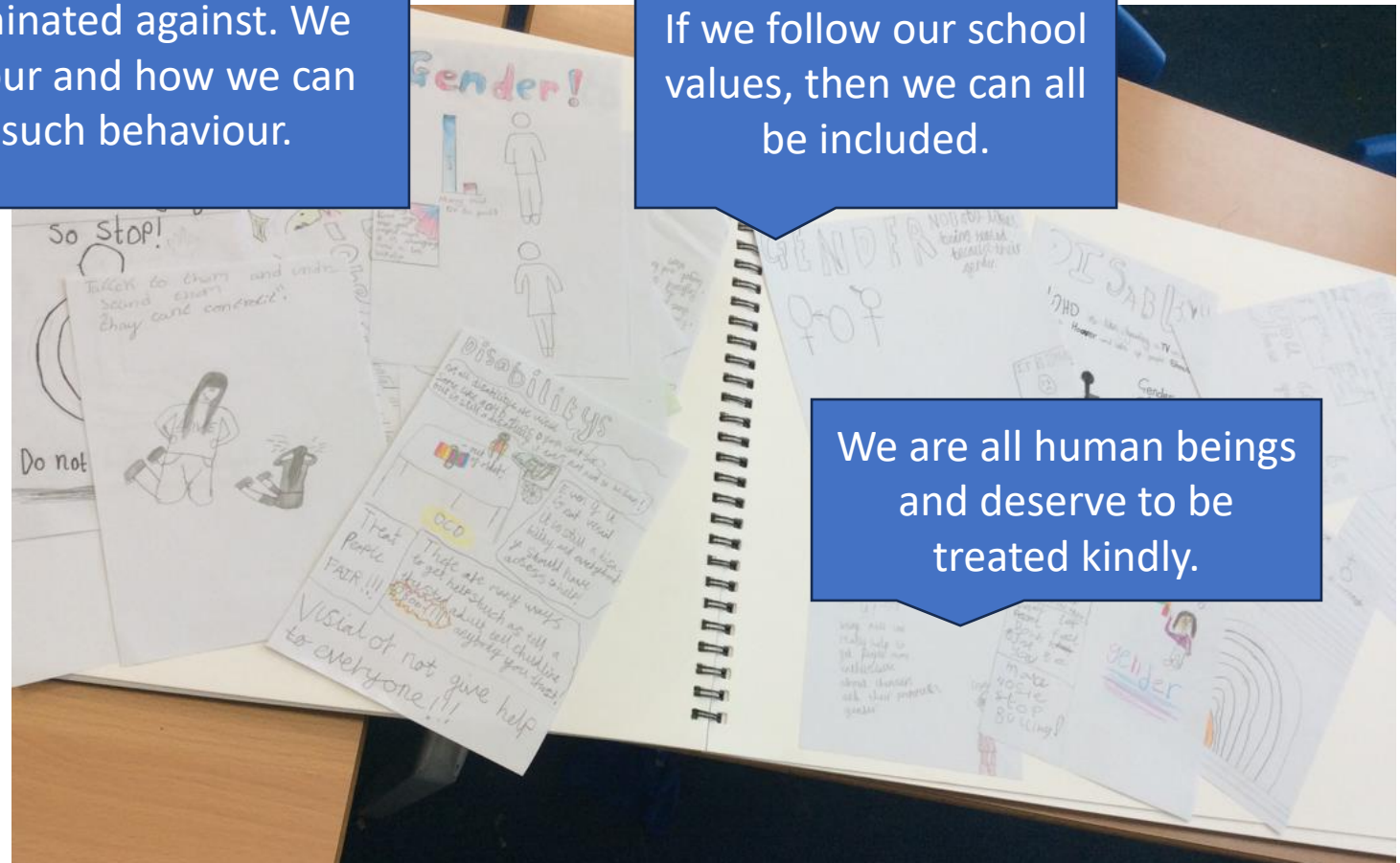
I know that rumour and name-calling can be bullying behaviours and can come up with strategies to prevent this behaviour.
