The Creation Story

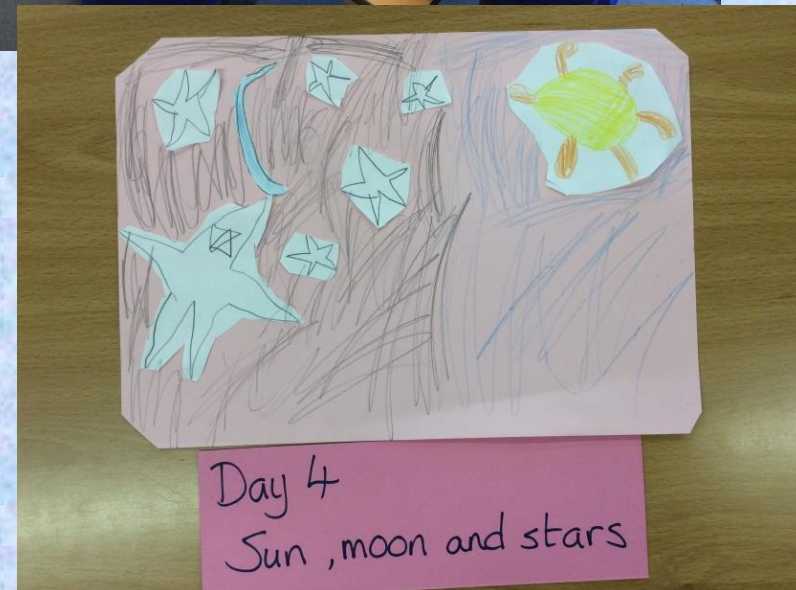
Identify core beliefs; give examples of how stories show what people believe.

"It tells Christians about God."



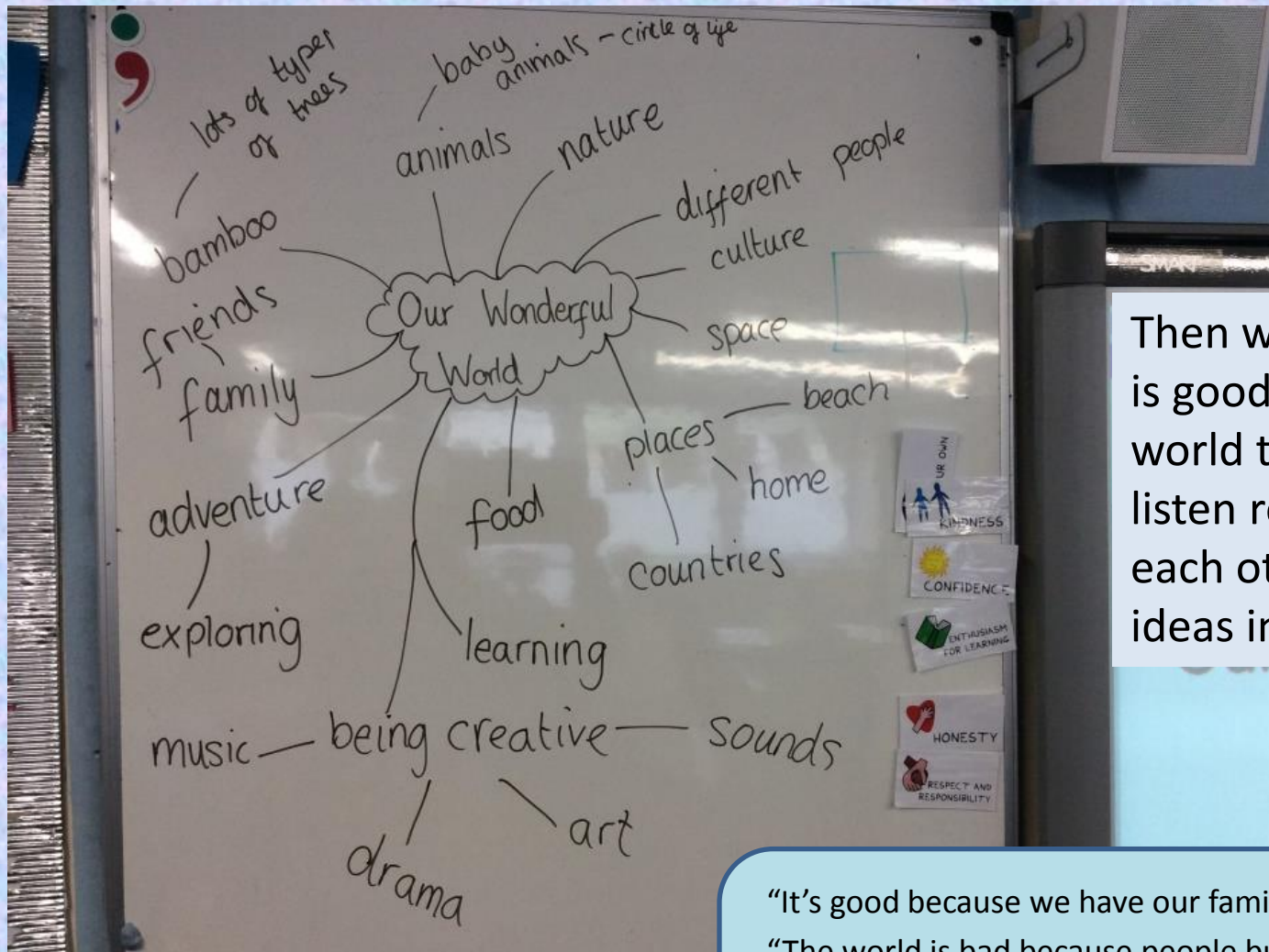


We thought carefully about the question 'How do Christians say thank you?' and learnt about Harvest Festival.
