#### Message from Chartwells re Increase in School Meal price

Following the Governments implementation of the Living Wage and to ensure our teams are paid an appropriate rate in line with the proposals, we have agreed with Cornwall Council the schools meal price from September 2016 for all schools in the framework will be £2.30. To ensure there was no change to the meal price during the current school year we have worked with Cornwall Council to hold off with a meal price increase until September rather than this April when the Living wage came into force. The Council have sent out a communication to all schools in the framework confirming the new meal price as agreed within the framework.

We are currently finalising the new menus that will be delivered to you during the second week in July. The menu will have the new price of £2.30 clearly displayed as well as confirming that meals are free for Reception, Years 1&2 and we would appreciate it if these menus could be sent home with the children.
