For deeper learning, teachers are continuing to use the White Rose resource to aid planning which also includes new up to date assessment which will then be used to identify gaps to address. With it now being the second year of using this, teachers are able to adapt and amend as necessary to fit the children. The cross-curricular textbooks are also being used for this.

Links to maths across the curriculum are now more explicit. Examples of evidence are being kept by each class which show those opportunities planned for and their outcomes. From discussion amongst the teachers, they are more aware of ties when they are using opportunities to teach maths that arise from other subjects and are working towards a way of recording.
