Lin is a prolific composer and has written for BBC children's programmes for both television and radio. First Access Free whole class instrumental teaching



First Access is a 12 week programme which aims to introduce students in Key Stages 1-3 to learning an instrument. The scheme is delivered weekly for a term to the whole class, including the teacher.

The programme consists of:

- An initial planning meeting.
- 10 weekly 45 minute instrumental lessons (on the same instrument) for the whole class.
- · A review meeting.

The CMEH is able to offer grants to schools to fund a music specialist to deliver these sessions. The grants are available for any classes who have not previously benefitted from the scheme. Schools will need to identify a suitable deliverer for the sessions and also provide their own instruments. The Hub can assist in this as we have a list of teachers/organisations who are able to deliver First Access and also sets of instruments which can be hired at the subsidised rate of £70 per term.



A key part of the programme is that the classroom teacher learns alongside the students in order to develop their musical skills and confidence, therefore the classroom teacher is required to participate in the sessions. Awards for Young Musicians Programme

Do you know a talented young instrumentalist who needs help with musical costs? They may be eligible to apply for up to £2,000.

The Awards for Young Musicians programme is inviting applications from instrumentalists aged 5-17 playing any musical genre to join our 2016 Awards Programme. As well as receiving flexible funding towards the costs of their musical development, Award winners will benefit from individual support, which may comprise of mentoring, workshops and master classes with professional musicians, opportunities to observe rehearsals with professional orchestras and other musical partners, and performance opportunities.

The key criteria for eligibility are musical talent and financial need. Whatever they study, be it classical Western music, classical Indian music, jazz, folk, blues, rock or commercial music, young musicians can evidence their ability in a number of ways; it is not essential to have taken formal exams.

The deadline for applications is Friday 18 March 2016 and Awards will be announced in May 2016.

One of the Cornwall Music Education Hub's ensembles, the Cornwall Youth Orchestra, had the exciting opportunity of performing to a capacity crowd at the Royal Albert Hall.



The 98 strong ensemble, made up of young people aged 11 to 21, was conducted by 16 year old Angus Webster as it performed 'Prince Zal and the Simorgh', a musical epic by composer David Bruce, inspired by ancient Persian folklore. The Orchestra was joined by 22 young violinists from primary schools in Cornwall as well as 35 young violinists from Northamptonshire and 16 students from City University who accompanied the Orchestra on Iranian percussion. The junior violinists were led by 13 year Caitlin Boulton, whose father, Tim Boulton, is the Director of CYO. The tale of Prince Zal was narrated by four young actors from Cornwall.

The Orchestra was one of just 19 youth groups from across the country who were invited by Music for Youth to take part in this annual showcase of top quality music making following outstanding performances at the MFY

National Festival in Birmingham in July.
In addition to performing the Persian epic tale, the
Orchestra performed with singer Sam Ahira from Bedford
and were invited to close the concert by performing the
traditional Proms favourite, Elgar's 'Pomp and
Circumstance', accompanied by hundreds of Union Jack
waving children and a rousing chorus of 'Land of Hope and
Glory' from the audience, as well as a new 'Finale'
composed especially for the event by Music For Youth's
artist in residence, Joe Broughton. For this section, the
Orchestra performed alongside the Birmingham
Conservatoire Folk Ensemble.

"I know I'm biased" said Tim Boulton, following the orchestra's outstanding performance, "but I do think the Cornish musicians communicate with a particularly natural and uplifting quality.

They all seemed so at ease in this vast hall, exuding an infectious joyfulness and beauty - they were an enormous credit to Cornwall and to the many teachers, parents and schools who give so much to support young people's acting and music making."



CYMAZ Music Inclusion Update

FREE and highly subsidised Music Mentoring



Cymaz Music is welcoming referrals for Music Mentoring. We have 5 places which are fully funded and 5 places at a highly reduced subsidised rate of £200 (a good use of Pupil Premium Funds). All referrals are assessed and considered in terms of need. The scheme, funded by Cornwall Music Education Hub, is for children and young people who would benefit from some specialist one to one intervention. It aims to support Musical, Educational, Personal and Social development and is aligned to the RAAS (Raising Aspiration and Attainment Strategy). Music Mentoring can have a significant outcomes for children and young people.

A Music Mentor is matched with a mentee and following an initial meeting and planning session there are 10 (ideally) weekly sessions of an hour followed by a review, reflection and follow up meeting. To maximise impact and potential, Music Mentors work with teachers, professionals, parents/carers, to share strategies and approaches to working with the child/young person.

Other activities in schools

Cymaz Music continues to develop and deliver a range of activities aimed at increasing access and promoting inclusion. This includes working in the AP Academies, supporting alternative education, specialist work with Children and Young People in Care (with Carefree) and with children with SEN(D). We are working to broaden access, break down barriers and ensure an inclusive and high quality offer.

Work has been taking place in Special Schools and in ARB units in mainstream schools. We are offering training, support and music delivery in these settings, with a focus on Music Technology.

In a recent training session at Richard Lander School, a team of 11 teachers and support staff enjoyed learning about using iPads and apps to create music. After using each app it was discussed how they could use and apply the knowledge gained with their students. When asked about the apps they felt "there was an app for all student's abilities."

The training went well and has prepared the staff and given them a basic understanding before music sessions begin. There will be further time during sessions to explore the apps. As a direct result of this work, communications between teachers has led to enquiries from other schools to work in their ARBs.

Connect: Resound pilot in Cornwall

CMEH in partnership with Cymaz Music, Cornwall College and Five Islands School is piloting a system of using technology to provide tuition to students living in isolation. The project was pioneered by NYMAZ in North Yorkshire and now with funding from ACE the equipment is being tested in different areas. The equipment will be based at Cornwall College and in Five Islands School on the Isles of Scilly. Cymaz Music will be providing weekly small group tuition to pupils in the school via the technology based at Cornwall College. We are excited and pleased to be part of this national roll out and to be working in partnership to test out how technology can help to bridge gaps and break down barriers.

Mini Residency - January 2016

After last year's most extensive residency yet, the BSO collaborated once again with the Cornwall Music Education Hub and partners to bring a range of musical activities to Cornwall.



The mini residency visited over 20 locations with an exciting programme full of creativity, discovery and learning that spanned eight days, delivered by 10 professional musicians. The programme saw BSO Bash (percussion) and a BSO String Quartet tour primary and secondary schools including Newlyn, St Mary's C of E Primary School in Penzance, Pendeen School, Bishop Cornish, Duloe, and Budehaven Community School.

"The BSO Cornwall Residency provides a platform to ensure high quality music is accessible to all, by widening the music-making reach to inspire new communities that may have less accessibility to musical instruments, music tuition or concerts due to their rural location." Lisa Tregale, BSO Head of Participate

BSO Associates, musicians in the community, offered training for teachers and music support in primary and secondary schools including Charlestown and St Neot's Primary Schools. 340 students from Secondary Schools across the county attended a GCSE curriculum concert at Hall for Cornwall, presented by BSO Associate Patrick Bailey, enabling them to hear and explore the set works being performed.

Primary schools: Fourlanesend School, Torpoint, Burraton Community Primary School, Saltash, Trenode CE VA School, Looe and Menheniot Primary School, Liskeard all adopted a musician for a day. Each school had the opportunity to hear the musician play, take part in musical activities and ask questions about orchestras and music.

Early Years centres in Budehaven, Tintagel, Camelford and Bodmin saw 1- 4 year olds take part in fun-filled sessions with BSO Associate – Hugh Nankivell, where they enjoyed creative music-making, exploring sounds and instruments as well as singing together.

The 5 Notes composition workshops saw students from Bishop Bronescombe, Carclaze, Charlestown and Biscovey Schools create pieces of music from scratch using just five musical pitches. Each of the sketches created formed a movement of the whole 5 Notes Piece, which is to be recorded by BSO Musicians.

The BSO Cornwall Mini Residency culminated in an open access community celebration in Liskeard; with 50 local musicians BSO professionals, in a massed Community Orchestra Day. They joined forces with musicians from Liskeard's regular 'Sounds Vital' project, and formed an ensemble of mixed instruments and created together a new composition.

Still to look forward to are the BSO Resonate Strings concerts taking place at Hall for Gwinear, Hayle on 1st February and the Tolmen Centre, Constantine on 2nd February (01326 341353).


