"I really like the dad because he was so kind."




We created a story map of 'The Prodigal Son' and sequenced the story.





"The story map helps you put everything in the right order."

In the Christian faith, all people are important to God.



Bible	A Christian book consisting of an Old and a New testament.
God	For Christians, the creator and ruler of the universe and source of authority.
Love	An intense feeling of deep affection.
Forgiveness	A conscious feeling to release feelings of resentment towards someone or something that has harmed you.
Promise	A declaration that you will do something or something will happen.
Prayer	A request for help or an expression of thanks to God.
Belief	Accepting that something is true or exists without proof.
Parable	A simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson.
