

What could the plotter use to help them and why?




They didn't have batteries so you can't use a torch.

That they let the fireworks and bonfire.


They wanted to kill King James 1st.


They cut up

Gunpowder Plot	A mixture of materials that explode when a match lights them.
Conspirator/plotter	Someone who secretly makes plans to do something harmful
barrel	A wooden container shaped like a cylinder with a fat middle.
cellar	A room below the ground level in a house.
capture	To take control of something or someone – to take them prisoner.
confession	To say that you are guilty of a crime.
Guy Fawkes, King James 1, Thomas Percy, Robert Catesby	Are all leading figures in the Gunpowder Plot conspiracy.
