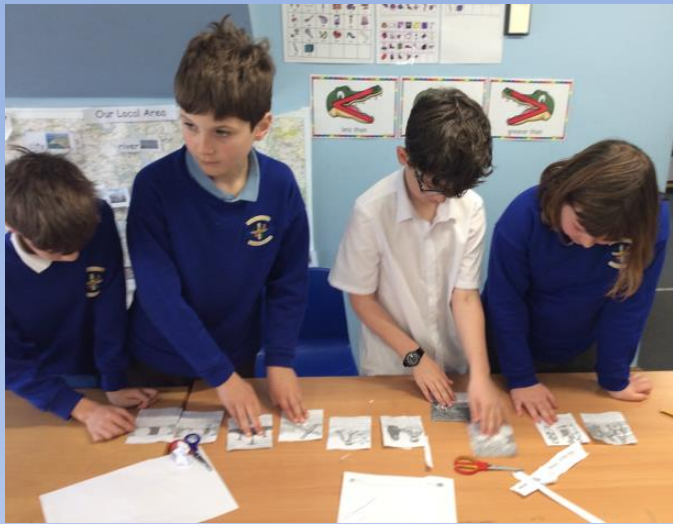

I was surprised to learn that it was one of Jesus's disciples that betrayed him.



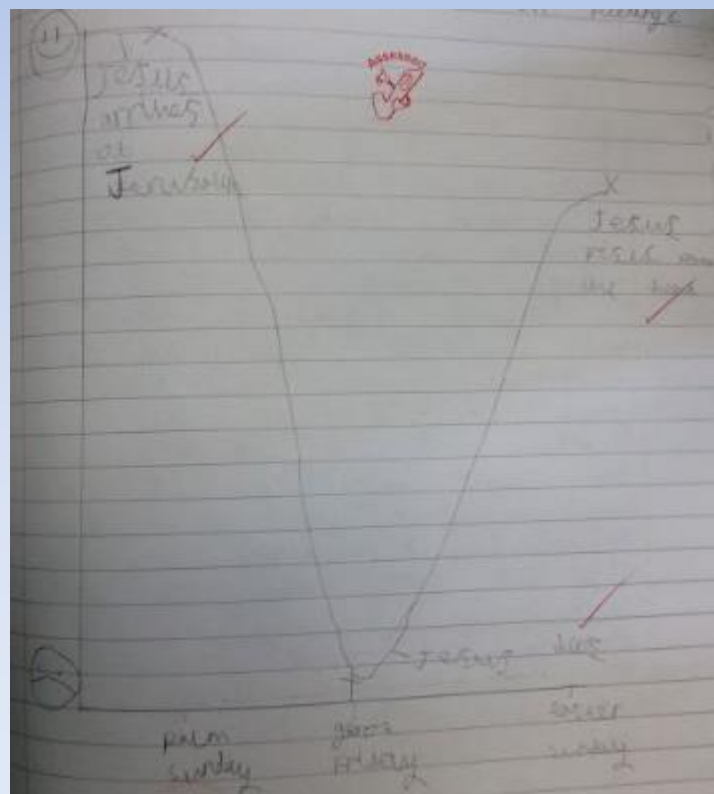
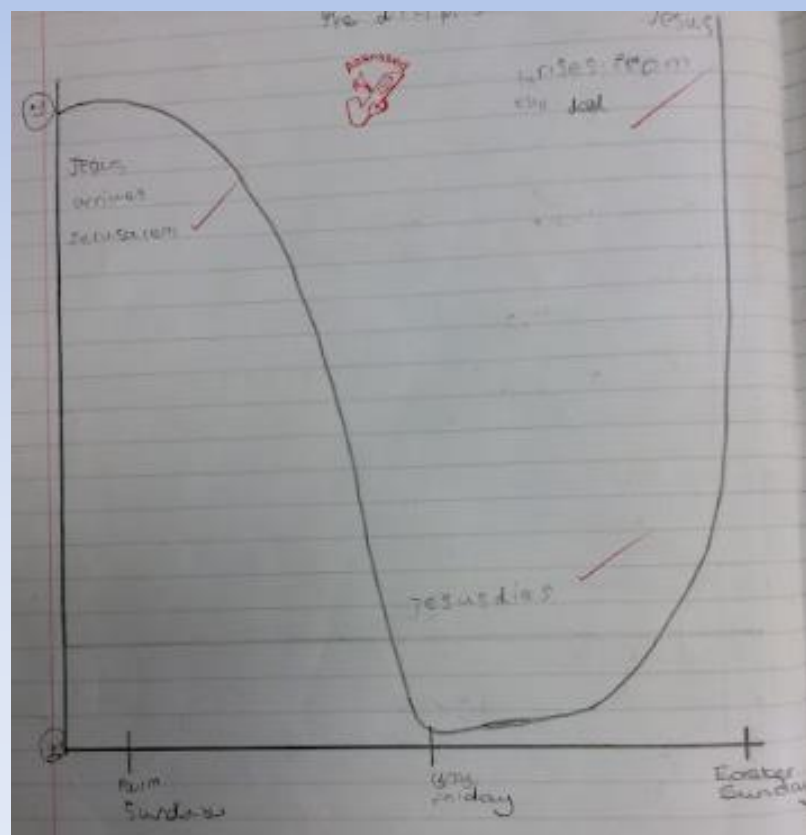
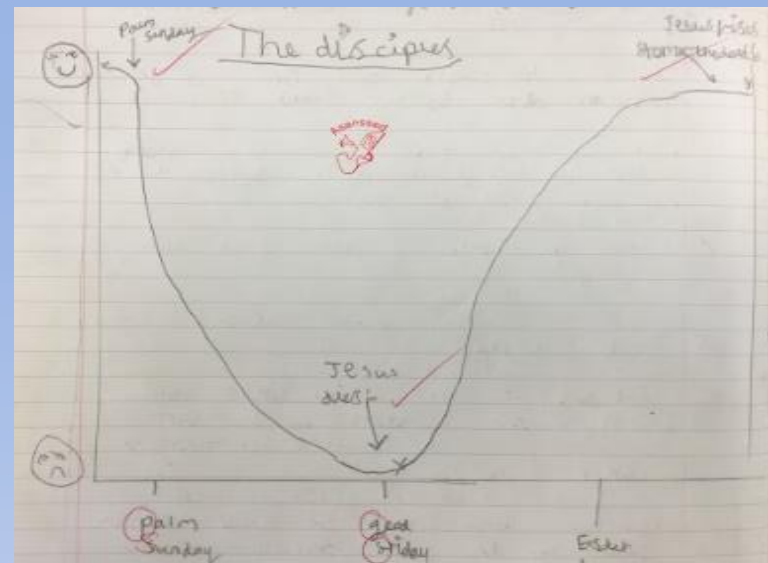
We re-enacted parts of the Holy week. We chose between Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday to show our understanding.

We reflected on the feelings and emotions of Jesus's disciples throughout the holy week. We represented this as a line graph.

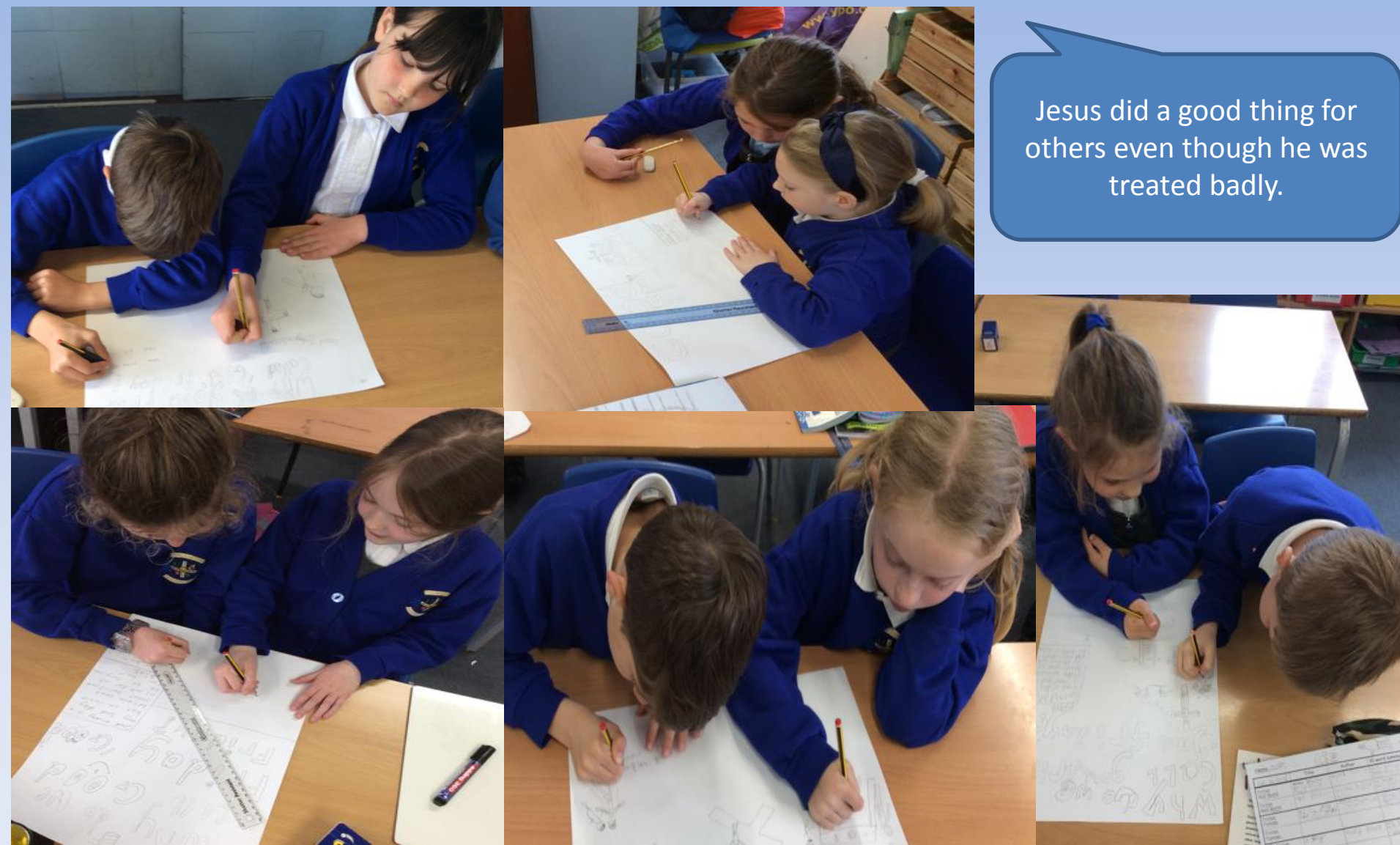
When Jesus arrived on Palm Sunday I think everyone would've felt really excited and curious.

| Sin | Christians believe that sin is any deliberate action that goes against God's law. Christian teaching explains that sin separates humans from God and prevents salvation. |
| Holy Week | In Christianity, Holy Week is the week leading up to Easter Sunday. |
| Salvation | Salvation is the act of delivering (or keeping away) from evil or saving from sin. |
| Palm Sunday | In Christianity, Palm Sunday is the first day of Holy Week and the Sunday before Easter. Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus Christ's successful entry to Jerusalem. |
| Good Friday | In Christianity, Good Friday is the Friday before Easter Sunday. It commemorates the execution of Jesus by crucifixion. |
| Easter Sunday | The festival of Easter is central to Christian belief because it is the Resurrection day, when Jesus was raised from the grave, alive again. This is why Christians believe in life after death. |
