"It's tricky to make sure you get the right names in the right place."



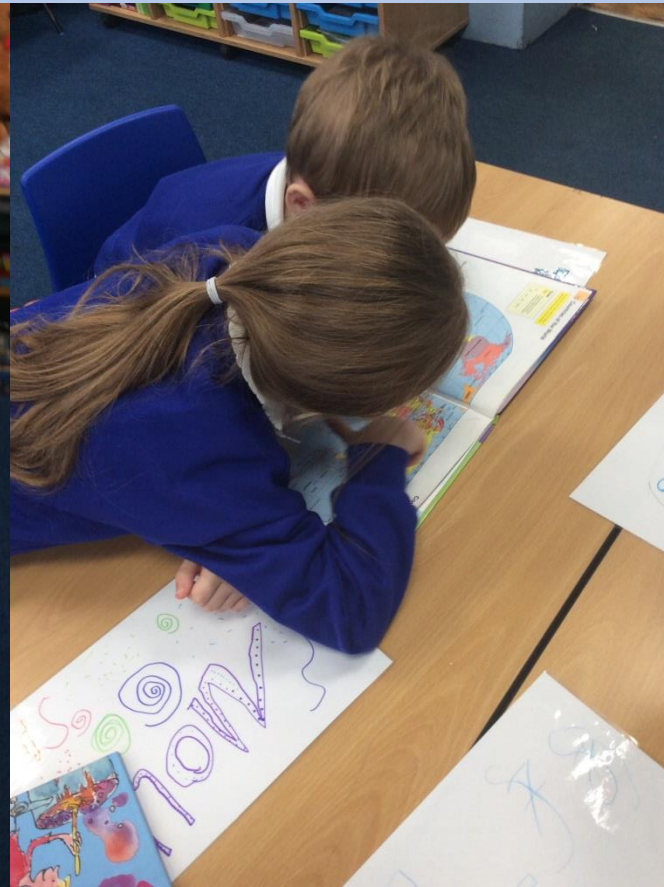
For our next session we looked at our continent of Europe and the different countries there. Next we found major cities in the UK.

The five oceans are the Arctic, Southern, Indian, Atlantic and Pacific Ocean.

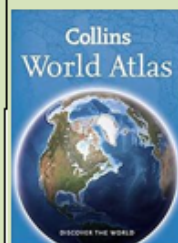
Europe is the second smallest continent in size.
