#### Fantastic Results!

We are always very proud of all our children and their achievements. At Fourlanesend we recognise that achievement is much more than results in tests etc and the most important thing is that children are happy, as this is when children will flourish. Saying that, it would be remiss of me not to share with you all the fantastic achievements of last years Y6 cohort. There are 268 primary schools in Cornwall and the children's scores ranked in the top quintile for Reading & Maths and Reading, Maths and Writing combined. Furthermore, they were 5th in County for their scores in Reading, 44th for Maths and 53rd for Grammar, Spelling and Punctuation - these are all the tests taken in Y6 SATs. We are really proud of the 17 children, their families and all the staff in school who have taught and supported them over their time here. If any of you are wondering why there is a delay in reporting this, it is because it takes time for County to collate all the data.
