



# Who do Christians say created the world?



After that, we looked at the story of Creation in the Bible and watched a video about what Christians believe God did on each of the seven days. We all liked the look of day seven where God got to have a rest!






# How to Christians say thank you for the world that God created?




We then looked at how Christians say thank you to God for giving us this wonderful world and how we have plenty of food to survive One way some Christians do this is though celebrating Harvest.

We created some artwork using chalk pastels [it got messy!] of baskets that Christians would take to church to share with everyone, the baskets contained foods that have been harvested.




