




Class Tamar Computing Internet Safety











We then learnt about how the internet works.








I used to think that

We learnt about how we access the internet and the sorts of things that you can share on the internet.











A router directs information around the internet.


After learning about how the internet works, we learnt about what an 'online community' means and reflected on what makes a good digital citizen
















We created our own online superheroes and presented what their superpowers are that make sure everyone is safe online.

Subject Specific Vocabulary

Cyberbullying	The bullying of another person using the internet, mobile phones and other digital devices, with the intent to deliberately upset them.
Email	Messages sent by electronic means from one device to one or more people.
Password	A secret word, phrase or combination of letters, numbers and symbols that must be used to gain admission to a site or application such as a website.
Online Communities	g group of people with common interests who use the internet to communicate (email, web sites, instant messaging).
Online Safety	Refers to staying safe when having a presence online.
Secure	Keeping personal information online safe.
Social Media	network An online platform that allows users to create a public profile and interact with other users on the website.
