No pictures because he is too special.


They feel him but don't see him, they believe he is there.

Allah has 99 names which all mean different things


Some of us have nicknames too!

I know who the Prophet Muhammed was and why he is seen as important to Muslims

We learnt lots about the Prophet Muhammed including his family. We did a quiz together and got lots of facts. We learnt he was told the words of the Qu'ran by Allah and wrote them all down.

The Qur'an is like their bible for them.


Their writing to them is normal, we think our writing is normal.

We learnt the Qu'ran is written in Arabic and Muslims try to learn all 112 chapters by heart. We learnt you must treat the book with respect if you are a Muslim and cannot just put it on the floor – it is too special. We thought carefully about the words in the book and thought about our own words which are important to us. We shared these with the class and wrote them on a special page to make our own special book. We decorated it using patterns.



I understand there are 5 pillars of Islam and can explain at least one.

Muslims have to pray 5 times a day and usually on a prayer mat.



When some Christians' pray they usually put their hands together, but Muslims go to the floor.

They pray to one God, called Allah, some go to a mosque to do this which is a special building.


