

What do we already know?




There are four seasons: Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter.

In Spring the sun light stays longer so we can do things outside after dinner. In Winter we can't do this because the sun sets sooner.






People love spring because there is more sunlight, it's a little bit warmer. Baby animals are born and they are calming to look at.




Spring is March, April and May.

What do we know about the summer?




The temperature is hotter in the Summer so people need to wear sunscreen and less clothing.






Why are there so many leaves on the floor in Autumn?




In Autumn a deciduous tree has its leaves change colour and fall off.

The leaves fall off because the temperature is colder and the tree can't make enough food for itself.

A coniferous tree has leaves that are called needles and they are pointy. They stay green all year.

Summer


The hottest season in the UK. It happens between June and August.
The longest day is June 21st

temperature

It is measurement of hot or cold that can be calculated using a thermometer

weather symbol

These are signs used to help us understand more about our daily weather
